INTRODUCTION TO THE HINWOOD FAMILY

The name HINWOOD is

This account tells of a branch of the HENWOOD family who lived around Salisbury, and who eventually used the spelling HINWOOD for their name. Of course in the early days there were many spelling variations apart from HENWOOD and HINWOOD, such as HENARD and INWOOD etc.. In order not to confuse this account these alternative spellings are only quoted when relevant.

The earliest recorded member of the family must be a **William HENWOOD** ⁽²⁷⁸⁾ who must have been born around 1570 at a place unknown, but probably near Amesbury, Wiltshire. Although **William** lived in Amesbury, a brother, **Thomas** ⁽⁷³⁾, who married **Agnes GILBARD** (or **Ann GILBERT**) ⁽⁷⁴⁾ at Salisbury St.Edmunds in August 1594, lived at Porton. **Thomas** was buried at Porton on 19th February 1617/18 and **Agnes** on 2nd June 1629. The death of **William** has not been found.

The two brothers had a sister, **Mary** ⁽⁷⁵⁾. **Mary** was first married to a Mr. **CARPENTER** ⁽⁷⁶⁾, and they had a son, **John**. She then married a Mr. **ARTHUR**, as a stepson, **Anthony ARTHUR** is mentioned in her will. Finally she married **John RYALL** (or **ROYAL**) on 8th October 1610. They had a daughter, **Joane RYALL**, who was buried on 10th April 1614 at Amesbury. **John** probably died in 1613, and **Mary** herself died in 1627, leaving a very detailed will and inventory of her belongings.

William had a son **Hugh (Hugo)** who became an ironmaster and the founder of a large family of blacksmiths. His family is described in the next chapter.

THE FAMILY OF HUGH AND MAUD HINWOOD OF WYLYE

Hugh HINWOOD ⁽²⁴¹⁾ married **Maud** (or **Matilda**) **SEBRY** in the parish of Wylye, Wiltshire, on 10th January 1618/19, and the unusually detailed entry in the marriage register (in Latin) records that **Matilda** (Latin form of **Maud**), an unmarried woman born of the family **SEBRY** in or near Cranbourne, Dorset, and in the employ of the Rector of Wylye as a domestic servant, was married to **Hugh HINWOOD**, a young bachelor and blacksmith of a certain **HINWOOD** working (i.e. artisan) family of Amesbury. The family tree is given on sheet 12.

Hugh was the son of **William HINWOOD** ⁽²⁷⁸⁾ of Amesbury, Wiltshire, whose brother **Thomas** ⁽⁷³⁾ died in 1617 and left **Hugh** a legacy of £10 (a goodly sum then), but **Thomas**'s overseers were to see that **Hugh** "*used the said sum profitably to help him forward in his trade and they suffer him not to spend it at his pleasure*". **Hugh** evidently used his legacy to set himself up as a blacksmith in Wylye and then to take a wife, and, by so doing, he founded a dynasty of blacksmiths in and around the Wylye valley which lasted for over 200 years.

Hugh and **Maud** must both have been born around the turn of the century (circa. 1600) and their nine children were born between 1620 and 1640, all register entries to 1630 being in Latin.

Elinor's father, **Hugh**, may well have come to live with her after her marriage. It is not known when **Maud** died, but in October 1675 **Hugh** made his will. He said he was of Bapton and was "*sicke and weake of bodye*". He must have been at least 75 years of age – a good age in those days. He left 5 shillings each to his daughter **Elinor**, and his grandson **John**, and made his elder grandson, **William**, an executor and residuary legatee. Why he did not mention other children and grandchildren we do not know, some had died and others may already have been provided for, so what little he had left went to those with whom he spent his last years. But **William** was only a child when his grandfather died so administration was granted to **William**'s father, **John INGRAM**, in 1679 because of **William**'s "non-age or minority". **Elinor** died in 1683.

RALPH ⁽⁷⁷⁾

Ralph, the first born son arrived on 1st April 1620 and was baptised the following day, and buried four days later on April 6th. **Frances** ⁽⁷⁸⁾ the first born daughter was baptised on 20th September 1621, by which time **Hugh** and **Maud** had crossed the River Wylye to the hamlet of Deptford, still in the same parish but on the north side of the river, and here they apparently remained. On 5th November 1623 a second daughter, **Maud** ⁽⁷⁹⁾ was born (baptised 4 days later), followed by a second son, **Christopher**, born on 13th March 1624/25, but not baptised until Sunday 18th December 1625, when the Fisherton Delamere register records that **Christopher** had been baptised in the Parish Church of Fisherton de la Mere, the adjoining parish whose church was on the same (i.e. north) side of the river at Deptford, "*because a great flood of water from melting snow caused the bridge to be broken thus barring the way of a pedestrian in Wylye*".

It is interesting to note that many of these parishes included land and hamlets on each side of the river, thus causing problems in times of flood.

On 21st June 1628 a third son, **John** ⁽⁸¹⁾, was born (baptised 2 days later) to **Hugh** and **Maud**, followed by a fourth son, **Gideon** ⁽²¹³⁾, baptised on 2nd May 1630. The following winter of 1630/31 was a bad one for the family when three of their surviving children were buried within five weeks, **Maud** on 4th January aged seven years, **Christopher** on 9th January aged six years, and **Francis** on 10th February aged nine years.

In July 1632 another daughter was born (baptised 1st August) and named **Frances** ⁽²¹⁵⁾, in May 1634 **Elinor** ⁽²¹⁶⁾ arrived (baptised 15th May), and finally in March 1639/40 a son **Hugh** ⁽²¹⁸⁾ (baptised 8th March).

Of these children **John**, the eldest surviving son, married **Elizabeth PATIENT** at Fisherton de la Mere in 1646 (see Chapter 2). The next son, **Gideon**, married **Margaret HULET** in Fisherton de la Mere on 11th May 1648, **Margaret** being recorded as “a minor”, although so too was **Gideon** (born 1630).

HUGH ⁽²¹⁸⁾

The youngest son of **Hugh** and **Maud**, **Hugh**, is believed to have married **Mary RANDALL** of Bower Chalke, only one child is known of this marriage, a daughter **Mary** ⁽²⁴³⁾, baptised at Fisherton de la Mere on 20th May 1666.

Hugh jnr. died in August 1674 in Bapton, a hamlet in the parish of Fisherton de la Mere, but on the opposite side of the River Wylde to the church, i.e. the south side. **Hugh**'s widow, **Mary**, not wishing to administer his goods, renounced her right to do so in a deed of revocation issued in the same month, and later in October 1674 administration was granted to **William RANDALL** “*father-in-law to **Hugh HINWOOD** deceased*”. **Hugh** was said by his wife to be a cordwainer (the former term for a shoemaker), although the inventory of his goods (worth £20) taken before his property could be administered, points to him being a small farmer. Apart from a very few domestic goods, he owned “*3 stocks of bees, a flitch of bacon, 8 acres of corn, and a cow and a pig*”. Maybe he combined the two occupations.

ELINOR ⁽²¹⁶⁾

The younger of **Hugh** and **Mary**'s two surviving daughters, **Elinor**, was baptised on 15th May 1634 at Wylde, the name being spelled “HENWARD”. She married **John INGRAM** ⁽²¹⁷⁾ on 20th May 1672. The marriage licence bond states that **John** was aged 35 years and a yeoman of Bapton in Fisherton de la Mere, and **Elinor** was a spinster of the same parish, aged 25 years (an understatement as she was in fact 37 years of age!). They had two sons, **William** and **John**.

THE FAMILY OF JOHN AND ELIZABETH HINWOOD OF WYLYE

John HINWOOD and **Elizabeth PATIENT** were married in the church at Fisherton de la Mere on 2nd November 1646. The register stated that they were “*married by Directory*”, an indication that it was a civil marriage during the period of the Civil War. **Elizabeth**, born on 2nd March 1627/28 (baptised the same day) was the youngest child of **John PASSION/PATIENT** (PASSION being the earliest form of the name) a farmer of Fisherton de la Mere and **Elizabeth HAYLOCK** of Tisbury. **John** was the eldest surviving son of **Hugh** and **Maud HINWOOD** of Deptford, in Wyllye.

John and **Elizabeth** apparently settled in Deptford where **John** probably assisted and ultimately took over his father’s business. There were seven children of the marriage, all baptised at Wyllye:-

Elizabeth ⁽²²⁰⁾ baptised in October 1647,
John baptised July 1649,
Gideon baptised March 1652/53,
William baptised May 1656 (direct line),
Alice ⁽²²⁶⁾ baptised 25th March 1657/58,
Elizabeth ⁽²²⁷⁾ baptised February 1660/61
and **Mary** ⁽²²⁸⁾ baptised 7th October 1664.

The first child, **Elizabeth**, had presumably died in 1660 (no doubt the burial was one of the many events which went unrecorded during the troubled Civil War and Commonwealth period). Later, in July 1674, **Alice** died aged 16 years.

Of the other five children **John**, the eldest son, married **Mary** and had ten children (see Chapter 3). Nothing is known of the two surviving daughters, **Elizabeth** and **Mary**.

GIDEON ⁽²²³⁾

He was baptised in March 1652/53 at Wyllye, a son of **John** and **Elizabeth**. He married **Margaretta** (sometimes written as **Margaret** in the registers) **HOPKINS** on 20th November 1676 at Stockton. They had nine children, all born at Stockton :-

Gideon born in 1678,
Margaret born in 1679,
Johanes (John) born in 1682,
Elizabeth born in 1683,
Maria born in 1686,
Thomas born in 1687,
John born in 1690,
Edward born in 1692
and **Sarah** born in 1694.

Gideon was a blacksmith [*faber ferrarius*] at Stockton, and was buried there on 26th February 1709. After his death **Margaret** obviously fell on hard times as she was “buried by the parish” [*eloomosinaria sepulta*] in October 1724.

GIDEON ⁽⁵⁷²⁾

He was the eldest son of **Gideon** and **Margaret**, baptised at Stockton in June 1678. He married **Joan WHITE** at Sherrington on 26th December 1736, and they had one child, **Mary**, baptised at Stockton on 8th November 1741.

MARGARET ⁽²⁷²⁾

She was baptised at Stockton on 1st March 1679, the eldest daughter of **Gideon** and **Margaret**. She married **Walter EVERLY** at Stockton on 27th September 1713.

JOHANES (JOHN) ⁽⁵⁷⁶⁾

He was baptised at Stockton on 8th October 1682, a son of **Gideon** and **Margaret**. He presumably died before a younger brother of the same name was born in 1690.

ELIZABETH ⁽⁵⁷³⁾

She was baptised at Stockton in October 1683, a daughter of **Gideon** and **Margaret**.

MARIA ⁽⁵⁷⁴⁾

She was baptised at Stockton on 8th July 1686, a daughter of **Gideon** and **Margaret**.

THOMAS ⁽⁵⁷⁵⁾

He was baptised at Stockton on 3rd July 1687, a son of **Gideon** and **Margaret**.

JOHN ⁽²⁷⁰⁾

He was baptised at Stockton in June 1690, a son of **Gideon** and **Margaret**. He married **Mary PLAYER** ⁽²⁷¹⁾ at Erlestoke on 15th April 1713, and they had a daughter, **Sarah**, baptised on 16th April 1716. However **Sarah** was buried at Stockton on 9th September 1720.

Mary was buried at Stockton on 26th January 1746, followed by **John** in the following year on 28th May 1747.

EDWARD ⁽⁵⁷⁷⁾

He was baptised at Stockton on 10th April 1692, as son of **Gideon** and **Margaret**. He married **Elizabeth FARLY** (or **FARLEY**) at Sherrington on 23rd September 1739 and they do not appear to have had any children. **Elizabeth** was buried at Stockton on 25th July 1754 and **Edward** was buried there on 15th December 1767.

SARAH ⁽⁵⁷⁸⁾

She was baptised at Stockton on 17th February 1694, the youngest daughter of **Gideon** and **Margaret**.

WILLIAM (224)

William, the youngest son of **John** and **Elizabeth**, was baptised at Wylve in 1656. He married **Alice EVE** on 9th February 1677/78 by licence, the licence bond recording that **William** was a blacksmith of Wylve, and **Alice** a spinster of Wishford Magna. Their first child, a son, **William** (229) was born at Wylve a year later in January 1678/79, but by 1681 they had moved to Great Wishford, their second son, **John**, being baptised there in April. A third son (and last child) **Thomas** was baptised in Great Wishford in November 1684.

Alice was buried at Great Wishford on 22nd July 1723, followed by **William** only six months later on 8th February 1723/24. During the forty years he had lived at Great Wishford **William** had prospered and become a respected member of the community and a churchwarden for the parish, at least for the year 1716.

There is a gravestone in the churchyard, to the west of the church, inscribed as follows :-

*Here lieth ye body
of **William HINWOOD**
who died February
ye 6th 1723
Aged 67 years*

William left a will in which he described himself as a yeoman of Great Wishford. He gave his two sons, **William** and **Thomas**, one shilling apiece (they may already have had their share of the property), his niece **Alice WILLIS**, who was probably looking after him since his wife, **Ann**, died, received £40 and all the household goods. He also provided £10 to be spent on his funeral under **Alice**'s direction. His son **John** was to receive the residue of his personal estate and was appointed sole executor. **William** signed his will on 4th January 1723 just a month before he died.

WILLIAM (229)

William was the eldest son of **William** and **Alice**, born on 13th January 1678/79 at Wylve and baptised a day later. He was a churchwarden at Great Wishford in 1715, 1716, 1722 and 1723. He died, apparently unmarried, and was buried at Great Wishford on 31st December 1733.

JOHN (230)

John, the elder of **William** and **Alice**'s surviving sons, baptised on 25th April 1681 at Great Wishford, also remained in Great Wishford and on 6th November 1707 he married **Elizabeth COWDRY** (231) by licence. The licence bond reveals that **John** was a bachelor and blacksmith aged c. 24 years and that **Elizabeth** was a spinster of c. 20 years, and that they both lived in Great Wishford. However, they were in fact married in the neighbouring parish of Burcombe. Note that **John** was a blacksmith and it is likely that he took over his father's business when **William** took to farming, and as his father's residuary legatee, probably inherited the business and its premises.

John and **Elizabeth** had three children, all born at Great Wishford, **John** in 1708, **Elizabeth** in 1715/16 and **Alice** in 1719. **John**, like his father **William**, took his part in parish business, and in 1752 he and his son **John** were both signatories to the parish accounts, which included a payment of £1 – 18s – 1/2d to **John HINWOOD** (though it is uncertain which one) “*for work done about the bells*”.

John was buried at Great Wishford on 25th May 1755 and his will made just three weeks before his death records him as a “gentleman” of Great Wishford. It is interesting how each generation tries to upgrade its status! He left his wife, **Elizabeth**, an annuity of £10 p.a. for life and the use of half the furniture and household goods in his house, plus the use of the now uninhabited house called “Selfs”. **John** had evidently prospered and he left £200 to his unmarried daughter, **Alice Elizabeth**, who had married **Simon ORAM** in 1742, had died in 1755, so **John** forestalled any claim on his estate by his son-in-law, **Simon ORAM**, by leaving him one shilling. He also made bequests to his two grandchildren, **John ORAM** getting the house and orchard and his sister, **Elizabeth**, £50. The residue went to his son, **John HINWOOD**, whom he appointed his executor. His widow, **Elizabeth**, lived on until 1764, and was buried at Great Wishford on 6th May 1764.

JOHN ⁽²⁸⁶⁾

He was baptised at Great Wishford on 5th August 1709, a son of **John** and **Elizabeth**. Having come into his inheritance, he married in 1757 and through him the Wishford line continued for several generations. The marriage licence bond tells that **John** was a farmer of Great Wishford aged 50 years and **Jane BUSHELL**, a spinster of 25 years, also of Great Wishford. They had five children, all born at Great Wishford :-

John born in 1759
William born in 1760
Alice born in 1762
Thomas born in 1764
and **Jane** born in 1770

John continued the tradition of service to the community and was churchwarden and overseer of the parish of Great Wishford in 1783. He died in 1785 and was buried on 31st May 1785, his age being given as 73 years. His wife **Jane** was buried on 2nd March 1792, aged 59 years. There is an inscribed tombstone to their memory in the churchyard of Great Wishford.

JOHN ⁽³⁰⁵⁾

He was baptised on 23rd March 1759 at Great Wishford, the eldest son of **John** and **Jane**. He had a daughter **Mary** by **Mary WHITHORN** ⁽³⁰⁶⁾ BAPTISED ON 15TH October 1783 at Great Wishford. He later married her at Burcombe by licence on 23rd March 1785.

John was a yeoman farmer and owned some land, renting more from Lord Chedworth. **John** was buried at Great Wishford on 28th April 1803. He left under £2000 in trust for his wife **Mary**, brothers **Thomas** and **William**, and his sister **Jane**. All his farming effects went to **Mary** who carried on his farming interests until 1815, when the land she inherited from **John** was rented until 1818 by a Robert Saunders.

WILLIAM ⁽³⁰⁷⁾

He was baptised on 27th May 1760 at Great Wishford, a son of **John** and **Jane** (the register said “Jean”). He married **Sarah MITCHELL** ⁽³⁰⁸⁾ at St.Edmunds Church, Salisbury, on 7th January 1788, and they had six children: **John, William, Thomas, James, Alice** and **Mary**. His place of residence is unknown.

ALICE

Alice was born c. 1795, a daughter of **William** and **Sarah**. She married a Mr. **CHAPLAN** whose Christian name is unknown.

ALICE ⁽³⁰⁹⁾

Alice was baptised on 1st July 1762 at Great Wishford, a daughter of **John** and **Jane**.

THOMAS ⁽³¹⁰⁾

Thomas was baptised on 23rd April 1764 at Great Wishford, a son of **John** and **Jane**. He married **Mary BAKER** ⁽³¹¹⁾ ON 29TH September 1797 at Great Wishford, but they do not appear to have had any children. When **Thomas** died and was buried on 6th February 1809 at Great Wishford he only mentioned the children of his brother, **William**, in his will. The will gave him as a maltster of Wylve, but he was probably a farmer. His wife inherited his land interests and carried them on until 1815. Then, until 1818, the small parcel of land she inherited from **Thomas** was rented out.

JANE ⁽³¹²⁾

Jane was baptised on 31st October 1770 at Great Wishford, the youngest child of **John** and **Jane**. She married **Robert SMITH** ⁽²⁸⁵⁾ of Baverstock on 5th May 1800 at Great Wishford.

ELIZABETH ⁽²³⁷⁾ and **ALICE** ⁽²³⁹⁾

Of **John** and **Elizabeth**'s two daughters, **Elizabeth** was baptised at Great Wishford on 12th January 1715/16 and **Alice** on 2nd November 1719. We know from their father's will that **Elizabeth** had married **Simon ORAM** from Shrewton in 1742 at Great Wishford. They had three children, two of whom benefited from their grandfather's will, but a son, **William**, died in infancy, and **Elizabeth** too predeceased her father. **Alice**, the unmarried daughter mentioned in the will, married later on 23rd October 1766 to **Richard FROUD**, a grocer from Salisbury. As she was then almost 47 years of age (although she claimed to be only 35 on the marriage licence) it is hardly surprising there were no children from the marriage.

THOMAS ⁽¹⁸⁸⁾

Thomas, the youngest son of **William** and **Alice**, married **Elizabeth BAKER** ⁽¹⁸⁹⁾ on 4th July 1710 by licence at Fugglestone St.Peter (his name being spelt **HINARD**). The bond stated that **Thomas** was a bachelor and blacksmith aged c. 26 years and **Elizabeth** a spinster aged c. 22 years, both of Great Wishford. As one of the bondsmen was Thomas Baker, innholder [i.e.inn keeper] of Quidhampton, a hamlet in the Parish of Fuggleston St.Peter and adjacent to Bemerton, that is no doubt the reason that the marriage took place in the little church at Bemerton.

Thomas and **Elizabeth** had four children. The first, a son **Thomas**, was baptised on 4th December 1712 at Great Wishford, but by 30th June 1714, when a second son, **John**, was baptised, the family had moved to the Parish of Wylve, [probably to Deptford. Two further children were baptised at Wylve, a daughter **Ann**, on 5th May 1717, and a son, **William**, twelve years later on 2nd October 1729. **Thomas** died first and was buried on 2nd March 1753, and **Elizabeth** died in October 1755, There is a recumbent tomb in Wylve churchyard with the following inscription :-

*“Here lieth the body of **Elizabeth** wife of **Thomas HINWOOD** who died October 9th 1755,
Aged 66 years
Here lieth the body of **Thomas HINWOOD** who died February 28 1753 Aged 69 years”*

Thomas had returned to Deptford, probably to continue the family’s blacksmith business started by his great-grandfather.

Although **Thomas** did not make a will, his widow, **Elizabeth**, did in January 1755. She left £100 to her son, **Thomas**, in trust for her daughter, **Ann**, the wife of **Christopher SLADE** (in order that the money should be for **Ann**’s sole use and not subject to the intermeddling of her husband!). She also received the furniture and linen. **John** and **William** each received £14 – 17s and the latter a bed and bedding as well. **Thomas** inherited the house and shop and the kitchen clock and had to pay his two brothers £16 – 13s – 4d each out of the property. The three brothers were to be the joint executors and residuary legatees.

These four children of **Thomas** and **Elizabeth** all survived into adult life.

THOMAS ⁽¹¹⁵⁾

Thomas, the eldest son of **Thomas** and **Elizabeth**, was baptised on 4th December 1712 at Great Wishford. His family history is given in Chapter 5.

JOHN ⁽²³²⁾

John, the second son of **Thomas** and **Elizabeth**, was baptised on 30th June 1714, and married **Sarah KNIGHT** of Kingston Deverill on 30th October 1747 at Fisherton de la Mere. They had two children, **Elizabeth**, baptised on 8th October 1748, and **John**, baptised on 2nd August 1751, both of whom were born at Wylve.

ANN ⁽²³³⁾

Ann, the only daughter of **Thomas** and **Elizabeth**, was baptised on 5th May 1717 at Wylve, and married **Christopher SLADE** at Salisbury, St.Edmunds, on 5th August 1735.

WILLIAM ⁽²³⁵⁾

William, the youngest son of **Thomas** and **Elizabeth**, was born in 1729 at Wylve and married **Elizabeth INGRAM** in 1751. They had eight children. The first two, **Thomas** and **William**, were baptised in Fisherton de la Mere, and then the family moved up the valley to Stockton, where **Ann**, **Elizabeth**, **John**, **James**, **Christopher** and **Charles** were all baptised. Further details are given in Chapter 8.

THE FAMILY OF JOHN AND MARY HINWOOD OF STEEPLE LANGFORD AND WYLYE

JOHN ⁽²²¹⁾

John was the eldest son (born 8th July 1649) of **John HINWOOD** and **Elizabeth** (née **PATIENT**) of Wylve and was evidently married by 1675 because he and his wife **Mary** had their first known child, a son **John**, in April 1675/76. They had ten children baptised in three parishes. By the time the second child, a daughter **Mary**, arrived they were living in the neighbouring parish of Codford St.Mary where **Mary** was baptised on 31st March 1678, and then sadly buried at only nine months on 12th January 1678/79. A second son, **Gideon**, arrived a year later and was baptised there on 1st January 1679/80. During their short sojourn in Codford St.Mary, **John** became a churchwarden for the parish for the year 1677, so they must have moved there early in 1676, possibly already having contacts in the village.

By March 1681/82 they were back in Wylve where **Alice** was born on 15th February and baptised a month later on 17th March. **Richard** was born in 1684, baptised on 9th June, **Sarah** was born on 14th January 1686/87 (baptised on 12th February) and another **Mary** in 1688.

By January 1690/91 the family had moved finally to Steeple Langford where **Elinor** was baptised on 26th January, followed by **Jane** on 2nd November 1692 and **William** in 1695. **Richard** died and was buried on 30th May 1697 when almost 13 years of age, and **Alice** was buried on 22nd November 1705, aged 23 years, both in Steeple Langford.

On 17th November 1717 the Steeple Langford burial register records the burial of "*Mary wife of **John HINWOOD sen.***", so presumably **John** outlived her, but it is not known when he died.

JOHN ⁽²⁴⁴⁾

Of **John** and **Mary**'s ten children the eldest, **John**, was born on 27th February 1675/76 and baptised a month later on 28th March 1676 at Wylve. He married **Elizabeth EDMONDS** in 1700/01 and had eight children (q.v. Chapter 4).

MARY ⁽²⁵¹⁾

Mary was born on 8th December 1688 and baptised at Wylve on 12th January 1688/89. She had illegitimate twins, **Edward** ⁽⁵¹¹⁾ and **Thomas** ⁽⁵¹²⁾, baptised on 10th August 1721 at Steeple Langford, with no record of the name of the father. **Thomas** was buried on 20th August 1721 and **Edward** on 2nd September 1721. No more is known of **Mary**, nor indeed of four of her brothers and sisters.

WILLIAM ⁽²⁵⁴⁾

The youngest of **John** and **Mary**'s family, **William**, was baptised on 16th June 1695. He married **Sarah PLAYER** ⁽⁵⁶⁹⁾ in the parish of Bratton on the northern edge of Salisbury Plain on 16th December 1717 and had three children, all baptised in Bratton :-

John in 1722,
Sarah in 1725
And **Betty** in 1730.

William is believed to have settled in Bratton in the service of Jeffrey WHITAKER, a prosperous non-conformist yeoman (see "Sheepbell and Ploughshare" by Marjorie REAVES).

JOHN ⁽⁵⁶⁹⁾

John was baptised at Bratton on 15th July 1722, the eldest son of **William** and **Sarah**.

SARAH ⁽⁵⁷⁰⁾

Sarah was baptised at Bratton on 13th September 1725, a daughter of **William** and **Sarah**.

BETTY ⁽⁵⁷¹⁾

Betty was baptised at Bratton on 21st April 1730, the youngest child of **William** and **Sarah**.

Branches of this family are now to be found not only along the Wylde Valley but also on and around Salisbury Plain (including the village of Dinton where two further families of HINWOODs remain to be investigated), and there were still HINWOOD blacksmiths at Deptford for years to come. Indeed the smithy itself was only demolished in the 1960's to make way for road widening.

JOHN AND ELIZABETH HINWOOD OF STEEPLE LANGFORD

John HINWOOD and **Elizabeth EDMONDS** were married on Sunday 16th February 1700/01 in the parish church of Broughton in West Hampshire. The register records that **John** came from Steeple Langford and **Elizabeth** from Southampton, and that they were married by licence, but no licence allegation or bond appears to have survived. We know nothing of **Elizabeth**'s parentage, nor do we know why they chose to be married in Broughton.

John was the son of **John** and **Mary HINWOOD**, and although born in Wylde in February 1675/76 the family had moved to Steeple Langford when **John** was in his teens, and there he and **Elizabeth** settled. **John** was a blacksmith like most of his family.

Their first child, a daughter **Betty**, was baptised on 30th September 1702, a son **John** baptised on 20th April 1704 was buried a month later, and a second son **John** was baptised on 2nd June 1705. There followed a daughter **Frances** on 17th April 1707, **Mary** on 9th January 1708/09, and **Joanna**, baptised on 5th May 1710 and buried on 5th September 1711. Then came **Hugh** baptised on 27th October 1711, and finally **William** on 20th June 1714, but he was buried on 19th May the following year.

Elizabeth HINWOOD was buried on 18th January 1744/45 and her husband **John**, on 7th May 1749 when he was 73 years of age. **John** left a will made two years before he died: it is a homely document in which his wishes are set down clearly and it is free from the usual and often excessive legal verbiage. He is recorded as a blacksmith of Steeple Langford. His eldest son, **John**, received one shilling (probably having already been provided for). **Hugh** was to have all the blacksmith's tools and **Betty** and **Frances** "*all the beer and liquor in the house and freedom to pass and repass through the worker shop to brew or draw such liquors*" and they each get a bed and share the rest of the household goods. This grandson **William**, son of **John** gets one shilling as do "*Richard LOADER's two sons that he had by my daughter [Mary]*". The shilling bequest in these cases seems to be a sign of disapproval, especially as neither **Mary** nor her sons were named. But his eldest grandson, **John**, (son of **John**) gets a bed and the anvil if he becomes a blacksmith, and all the blacksmith's tools if his son, **Hugh**, dies without issue (in fact **Hugh**'s family commenced in 1751). If **Hugh** married then his sisters **Betty** and **Frances** were to get the house, taking only two beds, and **Hugh** was to pay them £20 a piece. **Hugh** and **Betty** were to be the joint executors.

There is also a detailed inventory of **John**'s goods taken after his death, listing his household and blacksmith's goods, including pewter dishes, kettles, skillets. A warming pan, fire dogs, a spit etc. in the kitchen; barrels, bottles and beer in the cellars; his wearing apparel, bedsteads (with bedding and curtains), coffers and other furniture etc.; brewing vessels, furnas and grate and "meat in the house". In the "shop" the anvil, vice, bellows, weights and scales etc. "all belonging to the smitherers business". This and more totalled just £27, but a year after **John**'s death administration was granted to one **John PAVIC** of Stapleford "*principal creditor of the late John HINWOOD*", the bond stating that the executors named "*deserted their rights upon their non-appearance*". What the story is we do not know, but it seems that **Hugh** and **Elizabeth (Betty)** were sitting tight and not anxious to pay their father's debts. One wonders what these amounted to and whether there was anything left for the family.

Of **John** and **Elizabeth**'s eight children, three had died in infancy. **Betty (Elizabeth)** remained unmarried and died two years after her father on 9th August 1751 aged 49 years and was buried at Steeple Langford.

JOHN ⁽²⁵⁶⁾

The eldest surviving son of **John** and **Elizabeth**, **John**, was baptised on 2nd June 1705 at Steeple Langford. He married **Mary HICKS** by licence on 22nd November 1729, the bond stating that **John** was a 22 years old blacksmith and bachelor of Porton in the parish of Idmiston and **Mary** a 23 years old spinster of Amesbury where they married. They had two sons back in Steeple Langford, **John**, baptised September 1730 (who was later left the anvil in his grandfather's will) and **William** baptised September 1732 and buried April 1735.

FRANCES ⁽²⁶⁰⁾

Frances, baptised on 17th April 1707 at Steeple Langford, also remained unmarried like her elder sister **Betty**, and was buried on 9th May 1773 at Steeple Langford, aged 68 years.

MARY ⁽²⁶¹⁾

Mary was baptised on 9th January 1708/09 at Steeple Langford. She was married on Christmas Day 1736 at Wilton to **Richard LOADER** and had three sons, **Barnet** baptised on 13th February 1737/38, **John** baptised on 16th August 1739, and **Richard** baptised on 6th March 1742/43, all at Steeple Langford. **Jean NEWLAND** is descended from the eldest son, **Barnet**.

HUGH ⁽²⁶⁴⁾

Hugh, who was baptised on 27th October 1711 at Steeple Langford, married three times, firstly to **Mary FATT** on 24th November 1732. The marriage licence bond records that **Hugh** was a 20 year old blacksmith and bachelor of Steeple Langford, and **Mary** a 30 year old spinster of Edington. **Mary** died only 20 months after the wedding and was buried at Edington on 22nd July 1734 as "*Mary wife of Hugh HENNARD*". On 7th December 1736 **Hugh** of Steeple Langford married **Sarah LEWDON** of Edington at Erlestoke. Neither of these marriages produced any offspring and **Sarah** must have died by 1747 because when **John** sen. Made his will in that year his son was evidently "unmarried". Then on 2nd June 1759 **Hugh** married thirdly at Steeple Langford to **Elizabeth WESTON**, and this marriage resulted in a family of six children, starting with **Thomas**, baptised February 1750/51, **Mary**, baptised January 1753, **William** in April 1755, **Ann** in January 1757, **John** in July 1759, and **Betty** in September 1762, all of whom survived.

Hugh died and was buried in Steeple Langford in April 1785 aged 73 years, and **Elizabeth** a year later in July 1786.

THOMAS (222)

The eldest son of **Hugh** and **Elizabeth, Thomas**, fathered a daughter, baptised in March 1780 as "*Laetitia daughter of Thomas HINWOOD and Mary LANE*". For some reason they did not marry and a year later, in June 1781, **Thomas** married **Ann FRY** in Steeple Langford by licence, from which we learn that **Thomas** was a bachelor and labourer aged 24 years plus (actually 30) and **Ann** a spinster aged 21 years plus from Heytesbury.

Four daughters were born to them, **Mary Ann** baptised January 1792 in Steeple Langford, **Sarah** baptised in January 1792 in Stapleford, **Elizabeth** and **Ann** baptised May 1795 and April 1800, both back in Steeple Langford. **Mary Ann** married **Henry MACEY** on 16th August 1813 at Fisherton de la Mere. **Elizabeth** died in 1821, aged 26 years.

Ann married **Joseph SNOOK** of Chilmark (born at East Tisbury in 1789) on 13th February 1825 at Warminster St. Denys, and they had three children listed in the 1851 Census for Chilmark : **Elizabeth** born circa. 1828, **George** born circa. 1836, and **Eli** born circa. 1838.

Thomas died aged 66 years and was buried in Steeple Langford in August 1816.

MARY (291)

Hugh and **Elizabeth**'s second child, **Mary**, like her brother **Thomas**, had a child out of wedlock, baptised in August 1789 as "*Elizabeth, daughter of Henry FURNELL and Mary HINWOOD*". **Mary** apparently never married and died in February 1802.

WILLIAM (293)

William, the youngest son of **Hugh** and **Elizabeth**, as far as we know never married and died in Steeple Langford in January 1818 aged 61 years.

ANN (294) and **ELIZABETH (BETTY)** (298)

Ann, the second daughter of **Hugh** and **Elizabeth**, married **Samuel CANENS** on 5th January 1783, and her younger sister, **Elizabeth (Betty)** married **Stephen BEST** of Wylde on 16th June 1788, both marriages in Steeple Langford.

JOHN (296)

Finally the third son of **Hugh** and **Elizabeth, John**, married **Hannah SHERGOLD** on 11th July 1784 and they had seven children: **Joseph** baptised on 7th January 1787 and buried 7th December 1790, **Elizabeth** born 3rd March 1790 (baptised 7th March), **Sarah** born 24th November 1791 (baptised 27th November), **Maria** born 12th October 1793 (baptised 13th October) and buried 18th September 1795, **Hannah** baptised 10th July 1796, **Anne** baptised 30th December 1798 and **Thomas** baptised on 19th October 1801.

Out of the five who survived it was left to the only son, **Thomas**, to continue the **HINWOOD** line in Steeple Langford. (**Elizabeth** may have married **John NASH** of Fisherton de la Mere at Wylde in 1808 – though **Elizabeth** her cousin, the illegitimate daughter of **Mary** above mentioned, is another possibility.)

THOMAS ⁽⁴⁶⁹⁾

Thomas was born in 1801 at Steeple Langford, the only son of **John** and **Hannah**. He married **Jane WEBB** ⁽⁴⁷²⁾, who was born at East Codford in 1797, at Codford St.Mary on 18th November 1821. They had a son, **Charles**, born in 1833. The 1851 Census for Steeple Langford gives the following information :-

The 1841 Census, however, suggests two further daughters :-

Elizabeth HINWOOD, born in 1827,
And **Ann HINWOOD**, born in 1829

Martha Jane, born 1st February 1850, was the illegitimate daughter of **Ann**. She married **George ROWE** (son of **Henry ROWE**) on 1st January 1868 at Steeple Langford Parish Church.

Ann herself subsequently married **George CROUCH** of Wylve on 23rd September 1854 at Steeple Langford Parish Church.

Thomas died in 1877 aged 75 years, and **Jane** died in 1878 aged 84 years.

THOMAS OF GREAT WISHFORD (1712-1765)

Thomas ⁽¹¹⁵⁾ was baptised on 4th December 1712 at Great Wishford. He married **Ann PERRIOR** ⁽¹⁹⁰⁾ on 24th December 1735 at Mere by licence, when he said he was a yeoman. They seem to have settled at Deptford near Wylle, and they had five children :-

Elizabeth baptised in 1737
Elizabeth baptised in 1738
John baptised in 1740
James baptised in 1742
and **Alice** baptised in 1753.

The three daughters died in infancy. **Ann** herself died and was buried at Wylle on 29th December 1755. Six months later **Thomas** re-married to **Ann SMALL** ⁽¹¹⁶⁾ on 24th June 1756 at Wylle by licence. **Thomas** was described as a widower and blacksmith, and **Ann** a 24 year old spinster, both of Wylle. They had three children, all born at Wylle :-

Alice baptised in 1758
Thomas baptised in 1761
and **Charles** baptised in 1763 (who died in infancy).

Thomas died at Wylle and was buried on 19th February 1765, leaving no will. Administration of his goods was granted to his widow, **Ann**. Eighteen months later **Ann** re-married on 27th August 1767 at Wylle to **Richard RUMSEY** ⁽¹⁹¹⁾ who died in 1771, and later to **Christopher BRANDIS** in 1773. **Ann** died in 1806.

ELIZABETH I ⁽¹⁹²⁾ and **ELIZABETH II** ⁽¹⁹³⁾

The first **Elizabeth** was baptised on 5th September 1737 at Wylle, the eldest child of **Thomas** and **Ann** (née **PERRIOR**). She was buried at Wylle on 17th October 1737.

The second **Elizabeth** was baptised at Wylle on 13th October 1738. She was buried on 2nd June 1739.

JOHN ⁽¹⁹⁴⁾

John was baptised on 19th April 1740 at Wylle, a son of **Thomas** and **Ann** (née **PERRIOR**). There is no known record of any marriage, and he was buried as a pauper at Wylle on 3rd February 1809 aged 69.

JAMES ⁽¹⁹⁵⁾

James was baptised on 17th October 1742 at Wylle, a son of **Thomas** and **Ann** (née **PERRIOR**). He married **Edith LOCK** ⁽¹⁹⁶⁾, born in 1735, the daughter of **Henry** and **Jane LOCK**, at Wylle on 14th September 1769, and they had three children, all born at Wylle :-

Jane baptised on 15th August 1770
Thomas baptised on 1st May 1772
and **Ann** baptised on 2nd February 1774.

Edith was buried at Wylve on 17th December 1777, and **James** apparently re-married to **Mary PERRIOR** in May 1781 (according to their marriage licence bond, there being no record of such a marriage in the Wylve parish registers, and the wedding thought to have taken place in the Pertwood area of Chicklade). They had seven children :-

Elizabeth baptised in 1782
James baptised in 1783
John born in 1785
Mary born in 1787
John born in 1789
James born in 1791
and **William** born in 1794.

James was a blacksmith at Deptford. There are records of payments made to him by the Deptford parish for work done from 1785 to 1791, however he was buried as a pauper at Wylve on 12th February 1809 aged 67. **Mary** lived at Deptford until she died and was buried at Wylve on 19th June 1833, aged 79.

JANE (202)

Jane was baptised on 15th August 1770 at Wylve, the eldest child of **James** and **Edith**. She married **Edward SMALL** (203) on 7th April 1791 at Wylve, and they had ten children between 1792 and 1812.

THOMAS (204)

Thomas was baptised on 1st May 1772 at Wylve, a child of **James** and **Edith**. He was buried as a pauper at Wylve on 24th January 1805 aged 33.

ANN (205)

Ann was baptised on 2nd February 1774 at Wylve, a child of **James** and **Edith**. She was buried as a pauper at Wylve on 24th January 1810 aged 38.

ELIZABETH (206)

Elizabeth was baptised on 8th June 1782 at Wylve, a daughter of **James** and **Mary**. She married either **John NASH** of Fisherton de la Mere on 25th July 1808 at Wylve, or her second-cousin, **Samuel HINWOOD** on 24th August 1820 at Wylve. (It is uncertain which, though the latter is believed more likely. She was not the bride on both occasions as the term spinster was used both times). Her brother **William** and his bride to be **Elizabeth MOULD** were witnesses to the 1820 wedding, but a third witness, **Harriett HINWOOD** is not known.

JAMES (207)

James was baptised on 18th June 1783 at Wylve, a son of **James** and **Mary**. He was buried at Wylve on 9th January 1790, aged 6 and a half.

JOHN (208)

John was presumably born at Wylve in 1785, a son of **James** and **Mary**. He was buried on 18th May 1786 at Wylve, aged 1 year.

MARY (209)

Mary was baptised at Wylve on 28th March 1787, being born on 13th March 1787, a daughter of **James** and **Mary**. She was buried as a pauper on 22nd May 1806, aged 19.

JOHN (210)

John was baptised at Wylve on 28th January 1789 aged 3 weeks, a son of **James** and **Mary**. He married **Ann MEAD** at Steeple Langford on 21st February 1819 and they had three children :-

Mary Ann born 4th January 1820

John born 21st May 1821

and **Thomas** born 14th September 1824 and baptised 26th December 1824.

Mary Ann and **John** were baptised together at Codford Independent Chapel on 24th June 1821, giving a false impression that they were twins.

Mary Ann married her third cousin **William HINWOOD** (491) in 1845. They had six children, for details see Chapter 8.

John travelled to New South Wales around 1843, and married **Jane SMITH** there in 1844. They had seven children, two of whom predeceased them. He died on 30th October 1901 in Sydney, New South Wales, at which time he was an auctioneer's clerk.

Thomas does not appear to have married.

John (snr.) died on 23rd December 1854, aged 65 years.

[Another **John HINWOOD**, born around 1824 at Barford St.Martin, married **Elizabeth TRUBRIDGE** on 3rd August 1844 at Great Wishford, however his father's name was not stated on his marriage certificate. According to the 1851 Census for South Newton they then had two living children, **Ann** (born in 1845) and **James** (born in 1848), however General Registration certificates exist for two different children: **Julia** (born December 1844 at Stapleford) and **Charles** (born in June 1847 at Great Wishford).]

JAMES (211)

James was baptised at Wylve on 19th October 1791 aged 10 days, a son of **James** and **Mary**. Although no firm connection has been established, he possibly married **Eliza TAYLOR** at Warminster on 19th April 1813 (he was stated to be "of Codford St.Peter") and they had three children, all born at Rockbourne, Hampshire :-

Sarah baptised on 19th June 1814

Ann baptised on 17th June 1816

and **Elind** baptised on 10th March 1818.

Elind (sometimes spelt “**Elihud**”) married **Sarah HEALES** at Whiteparish on 21st March 1846, and they had four children. **Mary Hannah** born 1st March 1849 (who married **Charles ARNEY**, a son of **Elijah ARNEY**, at Bemerton on 23rd October 1869), **Elizabeth** born 7th November 1852 (who married **Lot WEST**, a carpenter, at Bath on 26th June 1871), **Matilda** born 7th February 1856 (who married **Frank ARNEY**, son of **Hezekiah ARNEY**, at Downton Parish Church on 19th May 1877), and **Edward Henry** born 27th September 1859. **Edward Henry** later became a wheelwright, and he married **Jane HAYTER**, daughter of **Georgwe HAYTER**, at Whitechurch Parish Church on 12th April 1884. **Jane** died in 1912, and **Edward Henry** is believed to have re-married within six months to **Emma HART**, he died in 1929. **Elind** was a mobile blacksmith, and indeed only two of his children were born in the same village. He died in 1872, though his widow subsequently re-married a **John STREET**, at Whiteparish in 1873.

James lived at Deptford where he was Hayward. On 28th December 1831 he was excused attendance of the Courts Baron Manor of Deptford. He was obviously not reappointed and was buried on 4th February 1837 at Wylve, aged 45.

WILLIAM ⁽²¹²⁾

William was born at Deptford and baptised at Wylve on 26th June 1794 aged 22 days, a son of **James** and **Mary**. He married firstly **Elizabeth MOULD** at Fisherton de la Mere on 30th November 1820 and they had five children, all baptised at Codford Independent Chapel :-

Mary baptised on 12th March 1822

William baptised on 27th June 1824

James baptised on 3rd June 1827, and buried at Wylve on 2nd August 1830

Samuel baptised on 23rd November 1828, and buried at Wylve on 10th March 1829

and **James** baptised on 4th August 1833.

Elizabeth died in 1841. **William**, a blacksmith by trade, re-married on 8th November 1844 to **Mary Ann CAREY**, the daughter of **James CAREY**, at Wilton, and they had two children, **Mary** born in 1847 and **James** born in 1849, both at Wylve. **Mary Ann** may have died shortly after the birth of **James** as she is not shown in the 1851 Census for Wylve, and **William** is described as a widower at that time, although no record of her death exists.

James, born on 2nd May 1849, married **Jane COOKE-PHRIPP** of Gillingham, Dorset (daughter of **William PHRIPP**, a grocer), on 10th September 1872 at Gillingham Wesleyan Chapel. He became a railway clerk, and they had four children; **Reginald James** born in 1875 at Acton, Middlesex, **Percival William** born in 1877 at Acton, Middlesex, and who died in 1883, **Gertrude Mary** born in 1879 at Mortlake, and **Harold William** born on 18th October 1885. None of them appear to have married.

ALICE ⁽¹⁹⁸⁾

Alice was baptised on 27th January 1753 at Wylve, the youngest child of **Thomas** and **Ann** (née **PERRIOR**). She was buried at Wylve on 22nd July 1753.

ALICE ⁽¹⁹⁹⁾

Alice was baptised on 30th November 1758 at Wylde, the eldest daughter of **Thomas** and **Ann** (née **SMALL**). She married **John SCAMMELL** ⁽²⁰⁰⁾ on 2nd July 1777 at Wylde and they had two children, **Henrietta SCAMMELL** baptised on 2nd June 1780 at Wylde, and **Sophia SCAMMELL** baptised on 12th September 1781 at Wylde. After her death on 10th February 1784 **John SCAMMELL** married **Mary SMALL**, sister of **Edward** ⁽²⁰³⁾ and niece of **Ann** ⁽¹¹⁶⁾.

CHARLES ⁽²⁰¹⁾

Charles was baptised at Wylde on 3rd October 1763, the youngest child of **Thomas** and **Ann** (née **SMALL**). He was buried on 25th March 1765 at Wylde.

THOMAS HINWOOD OF SEMINGTON (1761-18??)

THOMAS ⁽¹²⁰⁾

Thomas was baptised on 24th April 1761 at Wylke, a son of **Thomas** and his second wife, **Ann** (née **SMALL**). He married **Mary GIBBETT** (or **GIBLET**) ⁽¹²¹⁾ of Semington by banns at Warminster St.Denys on 8th October 1782, both signed. The witnesses were William SLEIGH and Dinah HOLVEN. The banns for **Thomas** were read at Trowbridge St.James. They had at least ten children, most baptised at Melksham Independent Church, and probably all born at Semington :-

Mary Anne baptised in 1783 at Trowbridge

Sarah

James born in 1786

Susanna born in 1788

William born in 1789

William born in 1790

Lydia born in 1792

Charles born in 1794

Alice born in 1796

and **Thomas** born in 1797 or 1798

and possibly **Margaret**, birth place and date unknown (a **Margaret** married **Richard PEARCE** at Ramsbury on 20th October 1833).

By 1786 the family were living at Semington. They appear to have been staunch Non-Conformists as all baptisms were at the Melksham Independent Church or Trowbridge Presbyterian Church.

They probably moved to Trowbridge early in the 1800's.

MARY ANNE ⁽¹⁶⁰⁾

Mary Anne was born on 3rd November 1783, and baptised at Trowbridge Presbyterian Church on 15th December 1783, the eldest child of **Thomas** and **Mary**.

SARAH ⁽¹⁶¹⁾

Sarah is an assumed daughter of **Thomas** and **Mary** who married **Thomas WOODMAN** ⁽¹⁶²⁾ on 5th April 1801 at Trowbridge.

JAMES ⁽¹²²⁾

James was born on 29th August 1786 at Semington and baptised at Melksham Independent Church on 29th March 1789 (the same time as his younger sister), a son of **Thomas** and **Mary**.

SUSANNA ⁽¹⁶³⁾

Susanna was born on 20th June 1788 at Semington and baptised at Melksham Independent Church on 29th March 1789 (the same time as her elder brother), a daughter of **Thomas** and **Mary**.

WILLIAM ⁽¹²³⁾

William was born at Semington on 24th November 1789 and baptised on 13th March 1790 at Melksham Independent Church, a son of **Thomas** and **Mary**. He presumably died when less than a year old as a brother was given the same name about a year later.

WILLIAM ⁽¹²⁴⁾

William was born on 3rd December 1790 at Semington and baptised on 8th March 1791 at Melksham Independent Church, a son of **Thomas** and **Mary**.

LYDIA ⁽¹²⁵⁾

Lydia was born on 5th May 1792 at Semington and baptised on 26th August 1792 at Melksham Independent Church., a daughter of **Thomas** and **Mary**. She married **Samuel WOODMAN** ⁽¹²⁶⁾ on 6th January 1824 at Trowbridge.

CHARLES ⁽¹⁶⁴⁾

Charles was born on 16th April 1794 at Semington and baptised on 19th August 1794 at Melksham Independent Church, a son of **Thomas** and **Mary**. He married **Mary BENNETT** ⁽¹⁶⁵⁾ on 12th July 1813 at Trowbridge. The witnesses were Ann WOOLVEN and William NIGHTINGALE.

After his marriage **Charles** went to Perth to join the Coldstream Guards. His son, **James**, was born in married quarters and baptised at St.Margaret's, Westminster, in 1819. **Charles** served at Waterloo, the Peninsular and in the Low Countries, being given an honourable discharge because of ill-health in 1834. In total he served from 13th December 1813 until 18th March 1834.

JAMES ⁽¹⁶⁶⁾

James was born in military married quarters in London and was baptised at St.Margaret's, Westminster, on 21st December 1819, the only child of **Charles** and **Mary**. He married **Sophia MARTIN** ⁽¹⁶⁷⁾, a widow, (née **MIMMS**) on 5th April 1860 at St.George the Martyr, Southwark. The Witnesses were James B.MIMMS and Elizabeth ESSEX. The certificate was incorrectly made out as it gives **James**'s father as "James" and **Sophia MIMMS**'s father as **Charles** "MARTIN". **James** and **Sophia** had three children :-

Alice Sophia born in 1861 at Gravesend
Florence Mary born in 1863 at Gravesend
and **Charles James** born in 1864 at Gravesend

At least from 1853 to 1855 **James** was an outfitter at 28 New Road, Gravesend. In 1856 he was a house, estate and insurance agent, living at 11 Parrock Street, Milton, Gravesend. At the time of the 1861 Census he was living with **Sophia** and an 18 year old house-servant named Ann RICHARDSON.

James was also a master upholsterer, a journalist and Quarter Master Sergeant of the Gravesend Detachment of the 1st Kent Artillery Volunteer Corps, which he joined in 1859. He was presented with a sword in 1860 (now in the possession of his grandson **Brian Charles HINWOOD**) by the then Commandant, Capt. ROSHER. He retired from the Corps in 1880, and died in 1889.

ALICE SOPHIA (168)

Alice Sophia was born in 1861 at Gravesend, the eldest child of **James** and **Sophia**. She married **William Albert GEORGE** in 1885 at Gravesend and they had three children, **Gertrude**, **Stanley** and **Harold**.

FLORENCE MARY (170)

Florence Mary was born in 1863 at Gravesend, a daughter of **James** and **Sophia**. She did not marry and died in 1947.

CHARLES JAMES (171)

Charles James was born on 7th October 1864 at Gravesend, the youngest child of **James** and **Sophia**. He married **Septima Emily FURNISS** in 1898, and they had three children :-

Gerald Marter born at Camberwell 1n 1900
Mary Kathleen (Molly) born in 1901
and **Brian Charles** born at Catford in 1903

Septima was the daughter of **Frederick FURNISS** of Ashford-in-the-Water, Derbyshire, an engineer responsible for many of England's railways. Her mother was **Septima MARTER**, a daughter of an East India Company merchant landowner of Knockholt, Kent.

Charles James was chief clerk at Messrs. ACKROYD & SMITHERS, London Stock Exchange. The SMITHERS family eventually bought the **MARTER** family estate in Kent. The family lived at Brockley, South-East London.

Charles died in 1930, and **Septima** on 11th October 1960 at Bromley, Kent.

GERALD MARTER (173)

Gerald Marter was born on 10th February 1900 at Camberwell, the eldest son of **Charles** and **Septima**. He married **Kathleen Vera HEWITT** of Brockley on 14th July 1928 at St.Peter's, Brockley. **Kathleen**, who was born on 14th November 1903 at Brockley was the daughter of **William HEWITT**, furrier of Diss, Norfolk, and **Mabel Geraldine** (née **RYALL**) of Yeovil, Somerset. **Gerald** served in both World Wars, as a rear gunner in the R.F.C. and on balloons during World War II with the R.A.F.. He boxed and played tennis for the R.F.C.. They had one *adopted* daughter, Jill Valentine (who had been born on 14th February 1937).

They lived in West Wickham, Kent, retired to Frinton-on-Sea, and then moved to Bellington, Macclesfield, Cheshire, where Gerald died on 14th May 1976.

MARY KATHLEEN (MOLLY) ⁽¹⁷⁵⁾

Mary Kathleen was born in 1901, a daughter of **Charles** and **Septima**. She married **Leo W. HARRIS** in 1930 in the Bromley area. **Leo** was employed by the Pearl Assurance and worked for them in Java and throughout the Dutch East Indies. After returning to the U.K. they lived at Knockholt, Kent, in one of the original **MARTER** estate houses. They had a daughter, **Leonie Mary Daffodil HARRIS** who was born on 3rd April 1935, who is on the British team of judges for Dressage. **Leonie** married twice, firstly to **Peter FELGATE** in 1958, through whom she had a daughter, **Sara**, born on 25th July 1961, and secondly to **Barry MARSHALL** in 1973, through whom she had a daughter, **Lisa**, born in 1974.

BRIAN CHARLES ⁽¹⁷⁷⁾

Brian Charles was born on 3rd September 1903 at Catford, London, the youngest child of **Charles** and **Septima**. He married **Gwendolyn Margaret SPENCER** in 1939, and they had three daughters :-

Bridget Mary born in 1939
Sally born in 1942
and **Susan Mai** born in 1944

Brian was assistant chief engineer for the South East Gas Board at Greenwich and was awarded the M.B.E. for services to the company during World War II, when under attack from the air over London, and for general service thereafter. He died on 21st February 1997.

They lived at Blackheath, South-East London, and retired to Tunbridge Wells.

BRIDGET MARY ⁽¹⁸¹⁾

Bridget Mary was born on 2nd July 1939, the eldest child of **Brian** and **Gwendolyn**. She married **Anthony HUGHES** ⁽¹⁸²⁾ in 1962 at Greenwich, and they had three children, **Keith Robert**, born on 6th June 1963, **Neil David**, born on 7th July 1965, and **Lorna Jane**, born on 2nd July 1969. **Keith** married a Miss **HALL** and had a daughter, **Lorraine**, born in June 1983.

SALLY ⁽¹⁸³⁾

Sally was born on 21st August 1942, a daughter of **Brian** and **Gwendolyn**. She married an Italian named **Elio BOSSI** ⁽¹⁸⁴⁾, and they had an *adopted* daughter, Franca.

SUSAN MAI ⁽¹⁸⁵⁾

Susan Mai was born on 28th July 1944, the youngest child of **Brian** and **Gwendolyn**. She married **Charles Postle BRONSDON** in 1964 at Greenwich, and they had two children, **Pandora Jane** and **David C.P.**

ALICE ⁽¹¹⁸⁾

Alice is an assumed daughter of **Thomas** and **Mary**, born at Semington around 1795. She married **Benjamin ROSE**, a widower, by banns at Trowbridge on 22nd June 1817.

THOMAS ⁽¹⁰⁰⁾

Thomas was born at Semington in 1796 or 1797 and baptised on 4th July 1798 at Melksham Independent Church, a son of **Thomas** and **Mary**. He married **Jane FOX** ⁽¹⁰¹⁾ on 19th April 1826 at Ramsbury. The witnesses were Ann WATTS and James BLAGRAVE. They had nine children, all born at Ramsbury :-

Mary Anne baptised in 1827

Eleanor Jane born in 1829

Elizabeth born in 1830

Sarah born in 1831

Fanny baptised in 1836

Thomas Lot born in 1838

Charles born in 1840

George William born in 1844

and **Susan Taylor** born in 1847.

Thomas was a currier by occupation (one who colours or dresses tanned leather). The 1851 Census for Ramsbury gives the following details :-

Jane was born in 1801, a daughter of **Thomas** and **Elizabeth FOX**. We can deduce that she died in 1849. For further details see Chapter 5 of "A History of the WATKINSON and HINWOOD Families" by Hugh A.KEARSEY.

Thomas re-married **Anna PLATT** (née **HOPKINS**), a widow and dressmaker, born circa. 1802, at Ebenezer Chapel, Ramsbury, on 18th December 1852. He died at Wandsworth in 1882, and **Anne** died there in 1872.

MARY ANNE ⁽¹⁰⁸⁾

Mary Anne was baptised on 24th June 1827 at Ramsbury, the eldest child of **Thomas** and **Jane**. She married **Ephraim BOBBY**, a son of **Thomas BOBBY**, at St.Giles Parish Church, Reading, on 8th May 1853, the witnesses being her sister **Eleanor Jane** and her husband **Henry HARRISON**.

ELEANOR JANE ⁽¹⁰⁹⁾

Eleanor Jane was baptised as **Eleanor Jane INWOOD** at Ramsbury on 26th January 1829, a daughter of **Thomas** and **Jane**. She married **Henry HARRISON** in 1850, who was a manufacturing chemist. His business was later bought by the Boots company.

ELIZABETH ⁽¹¹⁰⁾ and **SARAH** ⁽¹¹¹⁾

Elizabeth and **Sarah** were both baptised on 3rd July 1831 at Ramsbury, daughters of **Thomas** and **Jane**. The register gives their surname as **INWOOD**. **Elizabeth** married the 71-year-old draper **Thomas Lawes ADAMS**, a son of **Joseph ADAMS**, at Wandsworth Congregational Chapel on 24th May 1881. In 1851 **Sarah** was still living with her father in Ramsbury. She was later in service in London, and finally lived in Malmesbury, where she died in 1922 aged 90.

FANNY ⁽¹¹³⁾

Fanny was baptised at Ramsbury on 17th April 1836, a daughter of **Thomas** and **Jane**. In 1851 she was living at home with her father, and on 16th October 1858 she married **Edward LIDDIARD** at Ramsbury.

THOMAS LOT ⁽¹⁰²⁾

Thomas Lot was born on 12th April 1838 at 38 High Street, Ramsbury, and baptised there on 2nd May 1838, a son of **Thomas** and **Jane**. He married **Mary TUCK** ⁽¹⁰³⁾ on 2nd March 1859 at the church of St.Philip, Clerkenwell, London, by banns. The witnesses were John and Frances Ann BARNES. At the time **Thomas Lot** was a draper living at 229 Pentonville Road, but obviously he later moved to Malmesbury to continue as a draper. They had seven children, all born at Malmesbury :-

Henry Smyth born in 1860
William Francis born in 1861
Frederick Louis born in 1864
George Whitfield born in 1865
Ernest Theodore born in 1869
Marie Helena born in 1875
and **Arthur Victor** born in 1875.

(
In 1869 **Thomas Lot** was still a draper, but in 1881 the family was living at 83 Lower Gloster Street, Malmesbury, and he was employed as a bacon-curer. At that time they also had a 13-year-old domestic servant, Sarah JOHNSON, living with them.

Thomas Lot, a Justice of the Peace for Wiltshire, and Mayor of Malmesbury for 1892/93, founded the North Wilts Bacon Curing Co. (based in Park Road, Malmesbury) with a Mr. Alfred ADYE later known as “ADYE and **HINWOOD**”. The firm closed in 1964, the factory was pulled down and the land sold for housing. He died in 1926.

Mary TUCK was born in Cricklade in 1837, a daughter of **John TUCK**, a tanner, deceased at the time of **Mary**'s marriage in 1859. At the time of her marriage **Mary** was living at the same address as **Thomas**, and no occupation was given. She died in November 1919.

HENRY SMYTH ⁽⁹⁹⁾

Henry Smyth was born in 1860, the eldest child of **Thomas Lot** and **Mary**. He ran a gents outfitters in Alcester and never married. He is believed to have died in early 1937.

WILLIAM FRANCIS ⁽¹⁰⁴⁾

William Francis was born in 1862 at Malmesbury, a son of **Thomas Lot** and **Mary**. In 1881 he was a clerk to an accountant living with his parents. He married **Ann Eliza OXENHAM** ⁽⁹⁸⁾, a milliner, in 1886 at Dover. The witnesses were **Henry Smyth HINWOOD** and **Mary HINWOOD**. They had a daughter, **Marguerite Mary**, born in 1887. **William Francis** died in mid-1889.

MARGUERITE MARY ⁽⁹⁷⁾

Marguerite Mary was born in 1887 at Malmesbury, the only child of **William Francis** and **Ann Eliza**. She married **Francis H. RAYNER** ⁽⁹⁶⁾ at Dover in 1918 and they had two children, **Francis Rolf** and **John RAYNER**. **Marguerite Mary** broadcasted for the B.B.C. under the name of **Meg RAYNER**, and in 1968 was living in Sturminster Newton. **Francis Rolf** married **Josephine P. BELL** in the Weston area on 18th September 1968.

FREDERICK LOUIS ⁽⁹⁵⁾

Frederick Louis was born in 1864, a son of **Thomas Lot** and **Mary**. He married **Martha WILLIS** in 1885 and they had five children :-

Henry Thomas born in 1887
William Francis born in 1889
Helena Mary born in 1891
George Yorke born in 1894
and **Doris Jane** born in 1897

Frederick Louis was a draper and outfitter at Rushden, Northamptonshire, and died in 1901.

HENRY THOMAS ⁽⁹³⁾

Known as **Harry**, **Henry Thomas** was the eldest son of **Frederick Louis** and **Martha**, and was born at Rushden, Northamptonshire, in 1887. He married **Hilda HANDOVER**, a Red Cross nurse, in 1915 at Berkeley, Gloucestershire, and they had two sons, **Bernard**, born in 1916 (but who died in infancy), and **Robert**, born in 1923. **Harry** ran an outfitters shop in Malmesbury. **Hilda** died in 1986.

Robert, the second son of **Harry** and **Hilda**, married **Joan HOBBS** at Lacock Parish Church near Chippenham in 1952, and they had three children, **Susan P.**, born in 1953 (who married **David J. BRIERS** in 1972 at Chippenham and who had two children, **Michelle Ann** born in 1973 and **Christopher J.L.** born in 1975), **Anne E.** born in 1956 (who married **Michael L. BOUET** at Malmesbury Abbey in 1979 and who had two sons, **Edward R.** born in 1986, and **Thomas L.** born in 1988) and **Michael Robert** born in 1958. **Michael Robert** married **Carol D. CHILTON** at Malmesbury Abbey on 15th August 1987 and they had two sons, **James Thomas** born on 13th August 1991, and **Robert William** born in December 1993.

WILLIAM FRANCIS (136)

William Francis was a son of **Frederick Louis** and **Martha**, born in 1889 at Rushden. He died in 1890.

HELENA MARY (92)

Known as **Nellie**, **Helena Mary** was a daughter of **Frederick Louis** and **Martha**, born at Rushden in 1891. She lived at Bridport, Dorset.

GEORGE YORKE (91)

George Yorke was born in 1894, a son of **Frederick Louis** and **Martha**. Having travelled and worked in both India and the U.S.A. he returned to marry **Kathleen Mary WYLIE** (born 5th November 1915) of Bromley in 1941, and they had a daughter, **Georgina Mary**, born around 1942 (who married **Henry C.F. FOWKES** in 1965 and who subsequently had two sons, **George** and **Edward**), and a son, **Peter Wylie**, born in 1946, who lived in Bond Street, London. **George Yorke** became a director of Lloyd's Bank, and died in 1960. **Kathleen Mary** re-married Douglas I. ZEIDLER in 1966 and was now known as Mrs. **HINWOOD-ZEIDLER**. She died in 2004 or shortly thereafter.

GEORGE WHITFIELD (105)

Known as **Whitfield**, **George Whitfield** was born in 1867 at Malmesbury, a son of **Thomas Lot** and **Mary**. He did not marry.

ERNEST THEODORE (20)

Ernest Theodore was born on 9th June 1869 at Malmesbury, a son of **Thomas Lot** and **Mary**. He was introduced to **Mabel A. WATKINSON** (19) and married her on 16th October 1897 at Wandsworth. They had eight children, all born at Malmesbury :-

Gladys Mabel born in 1899

Dora Gertrude born in 1900

Eleanor Grace born in 1902

Ernest Arthur Thomas born in 1903

Hilda Clarice born in 1906

Mildred Florence born in 1907

MARIE HELENA ⁽¹⁰⁶⁾

Marie Helena was born in 1875 at Malmesbury, the only daughter of **Thomas Lot** and **Mary**. She married **Laurence SPURLING** at Westport Congregational Church, Malmesbury, in 1899, and lived at Stratford-on-Avon and New Barnet, Hertfordshire. They had one son and two daughters, **George Thomas**, born on 1st June 1900 and who married **Muriel A. STREET**, on 19th December 1935 at Loughborough and who died in 1991 having produced two daughters and a son, **Kathleen Mary**, who was born on 20th May 1905 and who died in 1996, and **Helena Joyce**, who was born on 9th January 1910 and who died in 1993.

ARTHUR VICTOR ⁽¹⁰⁷⁾

Arthur Victor was born in 1876 at Malmesbury, the youngest child of **Thomas Lot** and **Mary**. He married a farmer's daughter, **Annie Loverage SMITH**, in 1913 at Combyne Parish Church near Lyme Regis, and they had two children, **Penelope**, born on the 29th April 1917, and **Helah Mary**, born on 9th June 1921.

Penelope (known as **Biddy**) was assistant to the dietitian at Christ's Hospital, Horsham, and **Helah Mary** was a nurse. At the time of writing they are both living at Malmesbury.

Arthur Victor died in 1946 and **Annie Loverage** in 1969 at Malmesbury.

CHARLES ⁽¹³⁴⁾

Charles was born in 1840 at Ramsbury, a son of **Thomas** and **Jane**. Nothing more is known of him.

GEORGE WILLIAM ⁽¹³⁵⁾

George William was born in 1844 at Ramsbury, the youngest son of **Thomas** and **Jane**. Nothing more is known of him.

SUSAN TAYLOR ⁽¹¹²⁾

Susan Taylor was born in 1847 at Ramsbury, the youngest daughter of **Thomas** and **Jane**. She married **Cornelius J. MOODY** at Wandsworth in 1886, and lived in Corsham, near Chippenham, Wiltshire.

THE FAMILY OF ERNEST THEODORE HINWOOD

Ernest Theodore HINWOOD ⁽²⁰⁾ was born at Malmesbury in 1869 and married **Mabel Ann WATKINSON** ⁽¹⁹⁾ on 16th October 1897 in the Wandsworth area. They first lived at Malmesbury and had eight children.

Gladys Mabel born in 1899

Dora Gertrude born in 1900

Eleanor Grace born in 1902

Ernest Theodore was a director and representative of for the bacon-curing business “**ADYE & HINWOOD**” started by his father. He subsequently moved to Bulmershe Road, Reading, and his son, **Ernest Arthur Thomas**, then took over the running of the business around 1945.

Ernest Theodore died at Reading, and his wife, **Mabel Ann**, also died at Reading on 2nd January 1964 aged 91.

VERLIE STALLWOOD MARY ⁽²¹⁾

Verlie Stallwood Mary was born at Malmesbury at 09.15 hrs on 16th July 1898, the eldest child of **Ernest Theodore** and **Mabel Ann**. She married **Harold Edward Mafeking KEARSEY**. For further details on her and her family see Chapter 9 of “A History of the **KEARSEY** Families of Gloucestershire” edited by **Hugh A. KEARSEY**.

GLADYS MABEL ⁽²³⁾

Gladys Mabel was born at Malmesbury at two minutes past midnight on 19th August 1899, a daughter of **Ernest Theodore** and **Mabel Ann**. She married **William BARKUS** in 1928 in the Wokingham area. **William (Bill) BARKUS** worked for the Westminster Bank. They lived at Wantage, Hove, Bristol and East Leake in Nottinghamshire. After **Bill**'s retirement they moved back to Malmesbury to live in the house where **Gladys** was born. They did not have any children.

Gladys died at Malmesbury on 10th November 1984 aged 85. **Bill** also died at Malmesbury.

DORA GERTRUDE ⁽²⁵⁾

Dora Gertrude was born at Malmesbury at 02.10 hrs on 19th August 1900, a daughter of **Ernest Theodore** and **Mabel Ann**. She married **Victor TURNER** ⁽²⁶⁾ in 1927 in the Wokingham area. They lived at 21 Elm Road, Reading, and had three children :-

John Hinwood TURNER born in 1929

Pauline Ann TURNER born in 1931

and **Michael Rex TURNER** born 1934.

Victor is deceased, but at the time of writing **Dora Gertrude** is still living in Reading.

John Hinwood TURNER ⁽⁴⁰⁾ was born on 30th May 1929 at Reading. He lives in London and runs an English language school for foreigners in Putney.

Pauline Ann TURNER was born at Reading on 21st February 1931, and is married with children.

Michael Rex TURNER was born on 31st July 1938 at Reading. He lives in London and was a biochemist specialising in nutrition, though he is now the catering manager at the Barbican.

ELEANOR GRACE ⁽²⁷⁾

Eleanor Grace was born at Malmesbury at 05.00 hrs on 13th September 1902, a daughter of **Ernest Theodore** and **Mabel Ann**. She married **Lew GOWLER** in 1942 in the Hendon area, and they *adopted* a daughter, Nicola.

Lew is deceased, but at the time of writing **Eleanor Grace** is living in Binfield.

ERNEST ARTHUR THOMAS ⁽²⁹⁾

Known as **Arthur**, **Ernest Arthur Thomas** was born at Malmesbury at 04.10 hrs on 29th September 1903, the only son of **Ernest Theodore** and **Mabel Ann**. He married **Madge BARTLETT** in 1933 in the Reading area, but they did not have any children.

Ernest Arthur Thomas joined the Merchant Navy, but later ran the bacon-curing business until it closed. Both he and **Madge** are deceased.

HILDA CLARICE ⁽³¹⁾

Hilda Clarice was born at Malmesbury at 23.40 hrs on 5th March 1906, a daughter of **Ernest Theodore** and **Mabel Ann**. She married **Reginald PHILLIPS** in 1931 in the Reading area, and they had one child, **Brian A.**, born in 1938. **Reg** was a wireless operator in the Merchant Navy and was killed during World War II whilst he was on a tanker crossing the Atlantic.

Hilda died at Reading. **Brian** ⁽⁴⁷⁾ married and had two children.

MILDRED FLORENCE ⁽³³⁾

Mildred Florence was born at Caer Bladon, Malmesbury, at 21.20 hrs on 19th February 1907, a daughter of **Ernest Theodore** and **Mabel Ann**. She never married, and lived with her parents at Bulmershe Road, Reading. She is now deceased.

EDITH MURIEL ⁽³⁴⁾

Edith Muriel was born at Caer Bladon, Malmesbury, at 11.10 hrs on 23rd September 1909, the youngest child of **Ernest Theodore** and **Mabel Ann**. She married **Cyril HARDING** in 1938 in the Reading area, and they have a daughter, **Angela**, born on 4th October 1944 at Reading.

At the time of writing they are all still living at Ramsbury Drive, Earley, Reading.

THE HINWOODS OF STOCKTON, STRATFORD- SUB-CASTLE AND WHITEPARISH

WILLIAM ⁽²³⁵⁾

William was the youngest son of **Thomas** and **Elizabeth** (née **BAKER**) baptised on 2nd October 1729 at Wylze. **William** was a blacksmith from Deptford who married **Elizabeth INGRAM** (baptised on 19th November 1730, the daughter of **William INGRAM** of Fisherton de la Mere) of Bapton, Fisherton de la Mere, on 5th April 1751 at St.Martin's, Salisbury, They had eight children :-

Ann baptised at Stockton in 1756
Elizabeth baptised at Stockton in 1762
John baptised at Stockton in 1763
James baptised at Stockton in 1765
Christopher baptised at Stockton in 1767 (see Chapter 9)
and **Charles** baptised at Stockton in 1769.

William was buried on 15th April 1794 at Wylze.

THOMAS ⁽³¹⁴⁾

Thomas was baptised on 15th June 1752 at Fisherton. No parents' names were given in the parish registers, but he is assumed to be the eldest son of **William** and **Elizabeth**. He married **Jane MULLINS** (sometimes known as **Elizabeth**), who was born around 1755, on 16th January 1777 at Stockton. They had nine children,. All listed with birthdates in a singing book :-

James born in 1777
William born in 1778
James born in 1780
Elizabeth born in 1782
Thomas born in 1784
Jane born in 1786
Ann born in 1789
Mary born in 1790
and **John** born in 1793.

Thomas was buried on 7th April 1807, aged 55, and **Jane** died on 1st January 1818 aged 67.

JAMES ⁽³²⁹⁾

James was born on 2nd September 1777, the eldest child of **Thomas** and **Jane**. He died on 14th March 1780.

WILLIAM ⁽³³⁰⁾

William was born on 19th November 1778 at Stratford-sub-Castle, a son of **Thomas** and **Jane**. He married **Ann Rodber PESTER** on 20th January 1803 at Twyford, Hampshire, They had seven children. Full details of his family are given in Chapter 10.

JAMES ⁽³³²⁾

A second son **James** was born to **Thomas** and **Jane** on 2nd May 1780. He died on 22nd May and was buried on 26th May 1790.

ELIZABETH ⁽³³³⁾

Elizabeth was born on 24th August 1782, a daughter of **Thomas** and **Jane**. She married **Humphrey SCAMMEL** of North Tidworth on 4th September 1805 at Stratford-sub-Castle.

THOMAS ⁽³³⁵⁾

Thomas was born on 24th February 1784, a son of **Thomas** and **Jane**. He was buried on 24th July 1808 at Stratford-sub-Castle aged 24.

JANE ⁽³³⁶⁾

Jane was born on 19th March 1786 and baptised on 6th June 1786 at Stratford-sub-Castle, a daughter of **Thomas** and **Jane**. She married **James TITT** (sic) on 11th June 1810 at Fisherton Anger.

ANN ⁽³³⁸⁾

Ann was born on 4th October 1789, a daughter of **Thomas** and **Jane**. Nothing more is known of her.

MARY ⁽³³⁹⁾

Mary was born on 28th December 1790, the youngest daughter of **Thomas** and **Jane**. She married **James MARSH** on 12th September 1815 at Stratford-sub-Castle.

JOHN ⁽³⁴¹⁾

John was the youngest son of **Thomas** and **Jane**. He was born on 12th October 1793 and baptised on 9th June 1794. He died on 12th August 1796 and was buried on 14th August 1796 at Stratford-sub-Castle.

WILLIAM ⁽³¹⁶⁾

William was baptised on 4th January 1754 at Fisherton de la Mere, a son of **William** and **Elizabeth**. He married **Mary PATIENT** at Sherrington on 24th January 1782 and they had at least ten children (nine of whom survived and were mentioned in **William**'s will) :-

and **Jane Eliza** born circa. 1801.

William was a blacksmith at Whiteparish. He died around 1826, having made his will the previous year.

ELIZABETH ⁽³⁵³⁾

Elizabeth was baptised on 24th January 1783 at Stockton, the eldest child of **William** and **Mary**. She married **Edward ROGERS** on 8th June 1808 at Whiteparish.

WILLIAM ⁽³⁶¹⁾

William was a son of **William** and **Mary**. He married **Harriet EDSALL** (daughter of **Simon EDSALL**, a smith) on 28th January 1822 at Whiteparish. He had at least six children: **Caroline Jane**, baptised on 27th November 1822 at Millbrook, and who married **William PHILPOTT** (the son of **James PHILPOTT**) at St.Michael's, Southampton, on 13th July 1842, **Sarah Ann Sheperd**, born around 1823, and who married **Henry HORREBOW** (the son of **Henry HORREBOW**) at Southampton Register Office on 20th December 1843; **Emma Jane**, baptised at St.Botolph's, London, in 1825; **William**, baptised at St.Botolph's, London, in 1827; **Henry (Harry) William**, born in Spitalfields, London, around 1830, and **Tom**, born around 1839, probably at Southampton.

Henry (Harry) William moved to Southampton where, as a mastmaker, he married **Elizabeth VEAL** (the daughter of **Joseph** and **Jane VEAL**, baptised on 19th June 1831 at St.Mary's, Southampton, on 25th January 1852. They had nine known children :-

Elizabeth Ann, born on 13th April 1852
Henry Edsell, born in 1854
Eugene Eliza, born in 1857
Edith Dinah, born in 1858
Charles Tom, born in 1860
Sarah Harriet, born in 1862
William Shepherd, born in 1866

and the twins **Ellen Rose** and **Emily Lily**, born in 1868, but who died the same year.

Two of the brothers, **Henry Edsell** and **William Shepherd**, subsequently married and had children, almost all of whom were born in South Africa (see Chapter 12 and Charts for further details). **Elizabeth Ann** married **James WELLS**, a solicitors' clerk and son of **William WELLS**, at Holy Trinity Church, Southampton, on 6th October 1870. **William** senior ⁽³⁶¹⁾ died in 1849 and **Harriet** re-married a German musician shortly thereafter.

TOM

Tom was probably the last child of **William** and **Harriet**, and married **Mary Ann ROFF** (the daughter of **George ROFF**) at Portsea Register Office on 8th June 1867. At the time he was a ship's corporal on *H.M.S. Euphrates*, based at Portsmouth.

MARY

Mary was born in 1786, a daughter of **William** and **Mary**. According to her father's will she evidently married a Mr. **WRIGHT**. [A Mary HINWOOD married a widower, Samuel WRIGHT, at Christ Church, Newgate, London, on 21st February 1813, the witnesses being A.BAKER and Jane HINWOOD, though further research is necessary in order to establish a definite connection.]. She was a widow by 1825.

JAMES ⁽³⁵⁷⁾

James was a son of **William** and **Mary**. He married **Margaret WESTCOMB** at Downton on 25th January 1815. They had a son **John**, baptised at Whiteparish on 28th January 1816 (and, it is believed, a daughter also, **Margaret**, born in 1815 or later), **John** moved to Richmond, Surrey, where he married **Mary Ann HUMPHREYS** on 27th April 1851. They had eight known children; **Elizabeth** born in 1852, **William** born in 1854 (who married **Hannah Maria BRAGG**, née **YORK**, who was born in 1844, on 20th July 1878 at Richmond Parish Church, but who subsequently re-married to **Mary E. BRICE** at Richmond Parish Church on 23rd December 1886) and who died in 1892. [In the 1881 Census an apparent stepson from **Hannah Maria's** previous marriage, John T. BRAGG, who was born in late 1869, was listed as living with **William** and **Hannah Maria**]; **Fanny** born in 1858 (and who married **Charles KING**, a son of **George KING** at Richmond Parish Church on 20th October 1878); **Thomas William** born in 1860 (and who died in 1881); **Louisa** born in 1862 (and who married **Alfred HALEY**, a painter, at Richmond Parish Church on 6th July 1884); **Rhoda** born in 1865 (and who married **Samuel HANN** at St.Peter's, Hammersmith, on 1st April 1883); **Amelia Ann** born in 1866 (and who died in early 1872); and **Alfred John** born on 5th December 1868 (and who died in 1869). **John** appears to have been a general labourer; he died in 1894 and his widow, **Mary Ann**, died in 1902.

ANN PATIENCE ⁽³⁵⁹⁾

Ann Patience was born in 1790/91, a daughter of **William** and **Mary**. She married **William READ** at Whiteparish on 18th October 1808, and they lived at Stoney Cross, Hampshire. They had three sons, **William**, baptised on 6th October 1822, **Reuben**, baptised on 1st February 1824 (who was named as a successor to the land at Sherrington), and **Charles**, baptised on 26th March 1826, and four daughters, **Ann**, baptised on 24th August 1828, **Fanny**, baptised on 3rd October 1830, **Jane Elizabeth**, baptised on 2nd December 1832, and **Emma Patience**, baptised on 8th March 1835, and a grand-daughter, **Elizabeth**, born in 1849.

FRANCES

Frances was born in 1793 (or perhaps later), a daughter of **William** and **Mary**. She was unmarried when her father made his will in 1825.

CHRISTOPHER ⁽³⁵⁵⁾

Christopher was a son **William** and **Mary** who was born around 1794. He married **Sarah WINDSOR**, born circa. 1808, of Alderbury at Whiteparish on 22nd August 1835 by licence, and they had four children :-

Sarah born in 1837 at Whiteparish
Christopher born in 1839 at Whiteparish
Ann Windsor ⁽²⁷⁵⁾ born in 1842
and **Elizabeth Lovell** born in 1844.

The 1841 and 1851 Censuses describe **Christopher** as a blacksmith living at Whelpsley Tithing, Whiteparish.

A document exists at Trowbridge Records Office that states that **Christopher HINWOOD**, son of **William** of Whiteparish, blacksmith, and **Mary**, was land tenant of land at Sherrington acquired from William PATIENT in 1812, **Christopher** being about 18 at the time. A “James” was also mentioned, but no relationship or age was given.

Sarah married **James MAYNARD** at Southampton on 8th June 1867.

Christopher junior, born in 1839, married a cook, **Jane DALLEY** (the daughter of **William DALLEY**) from Fonthill Bishop on 15th April 1868 at Pau in France, and by 1871 they were running the 8 Bells Inn at Bolney, Sussex. He *adopted* a daughter, Emma DOUGLAS, from Argelès Gazost in the South of France, and they had three children of their own; **Elizabeth** baptised on 25th April 1869 at Hayward’s Heath; **Christopher** born in 1870 at Bolney, and **Ernest** born in 1873 at Bolney. Prior to **Christopher**’s death in 1875 they had moved to licenced premises in Brighton, where Emma DOUGLAS married in 1891 and **Elizabeth** married **Henry Charles HARRIS**, a valet at Brighton Parish Church on 29th October 1892. **Ernest** married **Eliza Jane ADLAM**, a 21-year-old daughter of **Charles ADLAM**, a master builder at Kensington in 1896, and an infant son, **Ernest Herbert**, died in 1899 at Brighton aged 1. **Ernest** senior died in 1902. Curiously, however, his widow (who re-married in 1909) names him as the father of **Ruby HINWOOD**, born at Rickmansworth on 24th October 1904. **Jane** died at Brighton in 1890 aged 51.

Elizabeth Lovell died in 1864 in Southampton aged 20. **Ann Windsor** died a spinster at Bridport in 1919, aged 75.

THOMAS ⁽⁴⁸⁷⁾

Thomas was the youngest son of **William** and **Mary**, born around 1796 at Whiteparish. He married (at Breamore in 1837, April 20th) **Patience POINTER**, who was born on 22nd April 1810 at Breamore, Hampshire, the daughter of **William POINTER** of Downton, Wiltshire (almost certainly born circa. 1780 at Sheffield English) and **Sarah** née **HOLLOWAY** [married Boxing Day, 26th December 1805 at Breamore, born 17th October 1783, the daughter of **Robert HOLLOWAY** and **Sarah** (née **WEBB**), married 1766, Breamore]. They had two children, both born at Whiteparish, **Thomas**, born in 1838, and **Mary**, born in 1839. **Thomas** snr. died in 1864 and **Patience** died in 1871.

THOMAS (482)

Thomas was the elder child of **Thomas** and **Patience**, born in 1838. He married **Agnes GARDNER** at Southampton on 17th August 1860 and they had five children; **Edith** born in 1861 (who married **Samuel William HOCKETT**, a photographer, on 22nd April 1886 at Old St.Pancras, London); **Alfred Thomas** born in 1865, **Julia** born in 1867 (who married **John BATTERLEY** on 9th June 1889 at Thurrock Parish Church); **Ellen** born in 1870 (who married **James Alexander HUXLEY** on 11th November 1900 at St.Paul's Parish Church, Homerton, Hackney), and **Mary** born in 1873. **Agnes** subsequently had an illegitimate daughter, **Edna**, born on 10th March 1876, which probably explains why she and her husband were living apart at the time of the 1881 Census. **Thomas** was living with his son **Alfred Thomas** at this time, whilst **Agnes** was living with three of her daughters (including **Edna**), he died in 1916 in the Salisbury area, and **Alfred Thomas** died in 1932 at the same place.

MARY (489)

Mary was the younger child of **Thomas** and **Patience**, born on 18th September 1839. She married **Thomas FULFORD**, an inn-keeper from Whiteparish and a son of **George FULFORD**, also an inn-keeper, at the Abbey Chapel, Romsey, on 17th February 1861, according to the rites of the Independent Church. They had four sons and one daughter.

JANE ELIZA

Jane was born around 1801, the youngest daughter of **William** and **Mary**. She married **William JURD**, a fisherman of Itchen, at St.Mary's, Southampton, on 5th February 1821. They had three sons and a daughter, all baptised at St.Mary's Extra, Southampton: **William** baptised on 16th November 1823, **Jemima Jane** baptised on 20th May 1827, **James Henry** baptised on 10th April 1831, and **Robert** baptised on 12th October 1834. [**Mary JURD**, baptised 13th September 1822, but buried on 1st December 1823, ascribed to **William** and **Anne JURD**, may also have belonged to this family, the incorrect annotation of the mother's name being due to not uncommon clerical error.

ANN (318)

Ann was baptised on 29th December 1756 at Stockton, the elder daughter of **William** and **Elizabeth**. She married **Martin WILKINS**, a gardener, on 7th January 1777 at Stockton.

ELIZABETH (320)

Elizabeth was the younger daughter of **William** and **Elizabeth**, baptised on 3rd March 1762 at Stockton. She married **James FLEMING** on 15th March 1786 at Stockton.

JOHN (322)

John was a son of **William** and **Elizabeth**, baptised on 13th July 1763 at Stockton. He is believed to have moved to Codford St.Peter and to have married **Michell CHURCHILL** there on 22nd September 1788. They had a daughter, **Ann** (342), baptised at Codford St.Mary on 20th September 1789.

JAMES ⁽³²⁴⁾

James was a son of **William** and **Elizabeth**, baptised on 4th September 1765 at Stockton.

CHRISTOPHER ⁽³²⁵⁾

Christopher was a son of **William** and **Elizabeth**, baptised at Stockton on 6th May 1767. Further details about him are given in Chapter 9.

CHARLES ⁽³²⁷⁾

Charles was the youngest child of **William** and **Elizabeth**, baptised at Stockton on 12th July 1769. He moved to Bishopstrow and married **Ann COMPTON** there on 29th July 1793.

CHRISTOPHER HINWOOD AND HIS FAMILY OF CODFORD St.MARY and CODFORD St.PETER

Christopher HINWOOD ⁽³²⁵⁾ was baptised on 6th May 1767 at Stockton, a son of **William** and **Elizabeth**. He married **Ann MILES** on 26th May 1788 at Codford St.Mary, and they had ten children :-

William baptised in 1788 at Codford St.Mary
James baptised in 1790 at Codford St.Mary
Samuel baptised in 1792 at Codford St.Mary
Elizabeth baptised in 1793 at Codford St.Mary
Sarah baptised in 1795 at Codford St.Mary
Ann born in 1797 at Codford St.Peter
Mary Merifield born in 1798 at Codford St.Peter
Thomas born in 1802 at Codford St.Peter
Martha born in 1804 at Codford St.Peter
and **Jane** born in 1805 at Codford St.Peter.

Christopher is believed to have died about 1820.

WILLIAM ⁽³⁶³⁾

William was the eldest child of **Christopher** and **Ann**, baptised at Codford St.Mary on 25th December 1788. He married **Sarah COLLINS** of North Tidworth by banns there on 6th August 1809, and (according to the 1841 and 1851 Censuses) had eight children :-

James born in 1810
Ann Collins born in 1812
William born in 1815
Mary Merifield born in 1818
Martha born in 1821
Charles born in 1827
Josiah born in 1830
and **Sophia** born in 1833

William was a blacksmith who died in 1851 aged 62. In 1851 **Sarah** was living at Codford St.Peter with her four youngest children. By 1861, however, she was back at Codford St.Mary on her own, and listed in the Census of that year as a pauper, nevertheless she lived another 19 years until she died in 1880 at the age of 94.

JAMES

James was baptised on the 13th May 1810 at his mother's village of North Tidworth, Wiltshire, a not uncommon practice in both England and Wales.

ANN COLLINS

Ann Collins was baptised on 15th March 1812 at Codford St.Mary, the second child of **William** and **Sarah**. Little is known of her.

WILLIAM ⁽⁴⁹¹⁾

William was born in 1815 at Codford St. Mary, the second son of **William** and **Sarah**. In 1841 he was a blacksmith living with his parents. He married his third cousin **Mary Ann HINWOOD** (the daughter of **John** ⁽²¹⁰⁾ and **Ann**, born in 1821) in 1845. [**James**, baptised 1st December 1839, may have been his son born prior to this marriage.]

By 1851 they were living at Wylve with their first three children, **Ann** born in 1846 (who married **William HARDING** in 1866), **Betsy** born in 1849, and **Sarah** born in 1850 (but who died in 1851), all being born at Deptford. There then followed **Mary Ann** in 1855 (who married **James BREWER**, a farm bailiff, at Gloucester Baptist Chapel on 29th March 1887), **John** in 1856 (who was a Sergeant-Major in the Royal Artillery at the time of his marriage to **Annie POTTER**, the daughter of **James POTTER**, a blacksmith, on 27th January 1891 at Wylve Parish Church, and who had two children, **Annie Potter** born in 1892, and **John William James** born in 1894), and **Sarah** on 9th September 1861 (who died in 1924, and was buried at East Dean). By 1861, however, they were running a public house, "The Deptford Inn", **William** combining his blacksmith's skills with victualling. **Annie Potter** married **David MORGAN** at Swansea in March 1927. **John William James** married **Vera C. ANDREWS** at Swansea in September 1925 and had a son, **John C.**, who was born in 1930 and died the same year at Swansea. **Annie HINWOOD** snr. died at Swansea in 1946 aged 79.

MARY MERIFIELD

Mary Merifield was a daughter of **William** and **Sarah** born on 11th October 1818.

MARTHA ⁽⁴⁹²⁾

Martha was born in 1821, a daughter of **William** and **Sarah**. She married **James DEAR** of Winterslow late in 1849, and they had a son, **Christopher**, in 1850. Prior to her marriage, however, **Martha** had a son **Henry**, born in 1842, and a daughter, **Elizabeth Ann**, born on 10th December 1846, but who died in 1852. **Henry** was baptised on 9th January 1843 at Codford St. Mary, and in turn married **Ellen FARLEY** (the daughter of **Thomas FARLEY**) on 2nd August 1862 at Heytesbury Parish Church. **Henry** and **Ellen** definitely had seven (though possibly nine) children :-

Charles baptised 15th March 1863 at Codford St. Peter

[**Emma** born in 1865 at Codford St. Mary, and who died the same year]

Sydney born in 1866 at Codford St. Mary

Ann born in 1868 at Codford St. Mary

Elizabeth Caroline born in 1873 at Warminster

Henry born in 1875 at Heytesbury

Fred born in 1876 at Heytesbury

Alexander born in 1877 at Heytesbury

and [**William** born in 1878 at Heytesbury, and who died in 1879]

Charles married **Margaret PARKER** (the daughter of **Joseph PARKER**) on 28th March 1891 at Crockerton Baptist Chapel near Warminster and they had a son, **Henry Charles**, born in 1892.

Sydney married **Mary WHATLEY** in 1892 in the Warminster area, and moved to Pontypool, Monmouthshire around 1895.

Ann (or **Annie**) married **William EVERETT** on 31st July 1887 (the son of **William EVERETT**) at Heytesbury Independent Chapel.

Elizabeth Caroline (evidently referred to simply as **Caroline**) marries **Luther GOSNEY** on 9th January 1892 at Warminster Register Office.

Henry, a coalminer, married **Annice S. LAWRENCE** (the daughter of **Henry LAWRENCE**) on 13th April 1903 at Ellwood Methodist Chapel near Bream, Gloucestershire, and they had eight children born in the Pontypool/Newport area of Monmouthshire, one of whom, **Ivy** (born in 1925) subsequently had an illegitimate son.

Frederick married **Florence E. HUNTLEY** in 1912 in the Newport, Monmouthshire, area and had four children.

Alexander married **Susan LAWRENCE** in 1903 in the Pontypool, Monmouthshire, area, and re-married to **Martha GRAY/PRITCHARD**, presumably a widow, in 1913. He had five children by his second marriage.

The last four of these brothers thereby founded a group of over 100 **HINWOODs** born in Soughth Wales between 1896 and the present day, some of whom, it is claimed, had twelve fingers and twelve toes!

CHARLES ⁽⁴⁹³⁾

Charles was born in 1827 in Codford St.Mary, a son of **William** and **Sarah**.

JOSIAH ⁴⁹⁴⁾

Josiah was born in 1830 at Codford St,Mary, a son of **William** and **Sarah**.

SOPHIA ⁽⁴⁹⁵⁾

Sophia was born in 1833, at Codford St.Mary, a daughter of **William** and **Sarah**. She married **William CHILDS**, a plumber and painet, at Islington, London, on 3rd June 1855.

JAMES ⁽⁴⁹⁶⁾

James was baptised on 1st December 1839 at Codford St.Mary. He was either the illegitimate son of **William** jnr. ⁽⁴⁹¹⁾ and his future wife **Mary**, or else the illegitimate son of another **Mary HINWOOD** as yet untraced. In the 1851 Census he was listed as a “G’son” (grandson) of **William** and **Sarah**, and in the 1861 Census he was described as both a servant and a jockey in his native village, but there is no trace of him in the 1881 Census.

JAMES ⁽³⁶⁴⁾

James was baptised on 10th May 1790 at Codford St.Mary, a son of **Christopher** and **Ann**. He married **Mary COLLINS** on 19th July 1830, but died shortly afterwards. The only child of the marriage, **Sophia**, was born on 15th July 1832 and baptised on 5th August 1832 at Codford Independent Church. She married **George ALLFORD**, a stonemason of Upton Lovell, on 15th June 1850, stating incorrectly that her father’s name was “William”. **Mary** re-married to John GOODFELLOW in June 1835 and had three further children.

SAMUEL ⁽³⁶⁵⁾

Samuel was baptised on 11th March 1792 at Codford St.Mary, a son of **Christopher** and **Ann**. He married **Elizabeth HINWOOD** on 24th August 1820 by banns at Wylve, and was buried on 15th January 1825 at Wylve, aged 32.

ELIZABETH ⁽³⁶⁷⁾

Elizabeth was a daughter of **Christopher** and **Ann**, baptised on 28th July 1793 at Codford St.Mary. She did not marry and was buried on 3rd September 1811 at Codford St.Peter.

SARAH ⁽⁵⁸³⁾

Sarah was baptised on 25th February 1795 at Codford St.Mary, a daughter of **Christopher** and **Ann**.

ANN ⁽³⁶⁸⁾

Ann was a daughter of **Christopher** and **Ann**, born on 12th March 1797 and baptised at Codford St.Peter on 19th March 1797. She married a younger man at Codford in 1833, i.e. **Michael Corp BAVERSTOCK**, born 1809, the son of **James BAVERSTOCK**, born 1771, and **Mary** née **CORP**, born 1782. In 1841 they are to be found at Mere with 3 children – **Samuel**, born 1835, **Lemira**, born 1836, and **Albert** born 1840. **Ann** was 78 when she died at Mere in late 1876, but only admitted to being 35 in the 1841 Census!

MARY MERIFIELD ⁽³⁶⁹⁾

Mary Merifield was a daughter of **Christopher** and **Ann**, born on 26th October 1798 and baptised on 29th November 1798 at Codford St.Peter. She married **Joseph COMPTON** at Chitterne on 31st July 1818.

THOMAS

Thomas was a son of **Christopher** and **Ann**, born on 24th January 1802 and baptised on 14th March 1802 at Codford St.Peter. He became yet another blacksmith and married **Jane WALKER** from Ferrybridge, Yorkshire, born around 1804. They had eight children :-

Matthew Henry baptised on 5th January 1827 at Codford Independent Church, and buried in 1844.

Samuel baptised on 6th March 1831 at Codford Independent Church.

Thomas baptised of 2nd June 1833 at Codford Independent Church.

Isabella Jane baptised on 12th May 1835 at Codford Independent Church.

Mary Ann born in 1838.

Edwin born in 1840.

Christopher born on 2nd November 1842 at Codford St.Mary, but who died in 1843

and **Lemira Ellen** born on 4th July 1844 at Codford St.Mary.

In addition there exists a bastardy bond (ref.: 1438/38 and dated 6th March 1823) for **Ann HINWOOD**, born 13th February 1823 and baptised privately on 17th March 1823 at Codford St.Peter, the daughter of **Thomas HINWOOD** (a blacksmith) of Codford St.Mary and **Mary Ann SMITH** of Codford St.Peter.

Samuel married **Mary MORGAN**, daughter of **John**, on 15th October 1855 at Warminster, and they had twelve children: **Louisa** born in 1856, **Henry** born in 1857 (and who died in 1921 at Chelsea), **Charles** born in 1859, **Ellen** born in 1860 (and who married **Frederick C. FOSTER**, an able seaman of Portsea, on 10th March 1889 at Canterbury Registry Office), **Robert** born in 1862 (and who died in 1895), **John Edwin** born in 1863, **Thomas** born in 1866, **William** born in 1867, **Mary** born in 1870, **Joseph** born in 1872, **Christopher** born in September 1874 (and who died in 1876), and **Samuel** born in 1876 (and who died in 1887). The first six of these children were born at Codford St.Mary, the next four at Chippenham, **Chistopher** at North Tidworth, and **Samuel** at Manton.

Mary Ann married **Joseph J. MOODY** of Chitterne All Saints on 25th April 1861 at Codford St.Mary Parish Church. **Lemira Ellen** married **Edward WHITE** of Maiden Bradley (the son of **Thomas WHITE**, a publican) on 20th March 1862 at Warminster Registry Office. **Isabella Jane** was married in 1862, to **John GRUMBLE** at Rugby. **Henry** died at Chelsea in 1921.

MARTHA (370)

Martha was the daughter of **Christopher** and **Ann**, born on 27th January 1804 and baptised on 11th March 1804 at Codford St.Peter.

JANE (371)

Jane was the youngest child of **Christopher** and **Ann**, born on 21st September 1805 and baptised on 31st October 1805 at Codford St.Peter. She married **Harry SWYER** at Codford St.Mary on 2nd August 1829.

THE HINWOODS OF WEST DEAN

WILLIAM ⁽³³⁰⁾

William was born on 19th November 1778 at Stockton, a son of **Thomas** and **Jane** (née **MULLENS**). He married **Ann Rodber PESTER** ⁽³³¹⁾ at Twyford, Hampshire, on 6th November 1803, and they had seven children :-

Mary Ann Rodber born on 1807 at North Tidworth
Susanna born in 1808 at North Tidworth
Jane born in 1809 at Stratford-sub-Castle
Thomas born in 1813 at Stratford-sub-Castle

and **Eliza** born in 1820 at West Dean.

William was a blacksmith at West Dean. He died there on 20th January 1849, and was buried on 27th January 1849.

Ann Rodber PESTER was the daughter of **John PESTER** and **Ann** (née **RODBER**), born on 9th April 1782 at Haselbury Plucknett, Somerset. **Ann Rodber** died on 17th November 1856 aged 74, and was buried on 22nd November 1856 at West Dean, as was her mother, **Ann**, who lived from 1754 to 1834.

JOHN PESTER ⁽³⁴³⁾

John Pester was born on 22nd May 1805 at North Tidworth, the eldest child of **William** and **Ann**. He was first baptised privately on 26th May 1805, and then publicly on 25th August 1805 at North Tidworth. He married **Elizabeth HARDIMAN** in 1831, and they had eight children :-

Elizabeth Ann born in 1833,
Jane born at East Grimstead in 1836,
Thomas born in 1839,
Edwin John born in 1843,
James born in 1849,

John Pester was a blacksmith at West Dean. He died on 6th March 1870 ages 64, and was buried at West Dean on 9th March 1870. **Elizabeth** was born in 1812 and died on 12th September 1866.

WILLIAM EMMANUEL (373)

William Emmanuel was baptised on 13th November 1831 at West Dean, the eldest son of **John Pester** and **Elizabeth**. He married **Caroline FUTCHER** (374) on 22nd April 1857 at Milford Street Wesleyan Chapel, Salisbury, and they had four children :-

Ellen Caroline born in 1858
Alice Jane born in 1860
John Futcher born in 1862
and **Frances Elizabeth** born in 1864.

William Emmanuel died on 14th March 1885. **Caroline** was born on 15th September 1822 and died on 28th October 1896.

ELLEN CAROLINE (412)

Ellen Caroline was born in August 1858, the eldest child of **William Emmanuel** and **Caroline**. She married **Edwin J. CHIPP** (413) in 1915 in the Salisbury area.

ALICE JANE (414)

Alice Jane was born on 21st January 1860, a daughter of **William Emmanuel** and **Caroline**. She did not marry, and died on 15th April 1883 aged 23.

JOHN FUTCHER (415)

John Futcher was born on 18th February 1862, the only son of **William Emmanuel** and **Caroline**. His birth was registered under the name of "John Fletcher". He married **Mary HARDING** in 1885 (416), and they had two children: **Fred Harding** (432) born in 1886, who married **Alice May FRY** (daughter of **Aquila FRY**) on 30th August 1911 at East Grimstead Methodist Church, and **Lilian Clare** (433) born in 1893, and who married **Bertram W. PAYNE** in late 1918.

John Futcher lived at Hayters Farm, Broughton, and was buried at Broughton on 21st June 1947. **Mary** was buried at Broughton on 4th November 1926.

FRANCES ELIZABETH (417)

Frances Elizabeth was born on 17th July 1864, the youngest child of **William Emmanuel** and **Caroline**. She married **Reuben BEAUCHAMP** on 4th May 1889, and they had nine children. **Charles, Alice Lucy, Francis, Ralph, Hilda, Walter Reuben, Frances Harriet, Robert Dan** and **Ellen**.

Frances Elizabeth died on 31st December 1943. **Reuben** was born on 26th June 1862 and died on 4th February 1941.

ELIZABETH ANN

Elizabeth Ann was baptised on 7th July 1833 at West Dean, a daughter of **John Pester** and **Elizabeth**. She married **George DAVIS**, a carpenter from Shirley, Southampton, and the son of **Robert DAVIS** a bailiff, at West Dean Parish Church on 10th June 1857.

JANE (375)

Jane was baptised on 24th September 1836 at West Dean, Wiltshire, a daughter of **John Pester** and **Elizabeth**. She married **Thomas CHUBB**, a yeoman on 3rd January 1859 at Southampton Register Office.

THOMAS (377)

Thomas was baptised on 4th August 1839 at West Dean, a son of **John Pester** and **Elizabeth**. He married **Ann MORGAN** on 10th May 1862 at Church Street Chapel, Salisbury, and they had six children :-

Ada Elizabeth born in 1863

Newton born in 1864

Louisa Ann born in 1866

George Edwin born in 1868

Fred John born in 1870

and **Charles Morgan** born in 1874.

Thomas ran the firm of **T. HINWOOD & Son**, baker and grocer of Broughton, Hampshire. He died at Broughton and was buried on 12th November 1928. **Ann** was born around 1834 at Broughton, a daughter of **Richard**, a butcher. She was buried on 8th July 1921. [The baker's shop etc. have now been demolished and the land sold for housing, a resulting road being named Hinwood Close, Broughton.]

ADA ELIZABETH

Ada Elizabeth was born early in 1863, the first child of **Thomas** and **Ann**. She was buried at Broughton on 31st October 1867 aged 4 and a half years.

NEWTON

Newton was born on 27th August 1864, the first son of **Thomas** and **Ann**. He died in early 1866.

LOUISA ANN (419)

Louisa Ann was born in 1866, a daughter of **Thomas** and **Ann**. She married **Thomas BLAKE** (420) in 1888, and they had six children; **Philip, Harvey, Roy, Edgar, Dora** and **Ada**.

GEORGE EDWIN (421)

George Edwin was born in 1868, a son of **Thomas** and **Ann**. He married **Elizabeth Josephine HOPE** (422) (a daughter of **Joseph HOPE**) at Portsea Register was baptised Office on 30th March 1891, and they had five children :-

May Hope born in 1891

Thomas George Morgan born in 1893

Beatrice born on 8th July 1895 and who died the same year

Charles Horace baptised 3rd July 1898, and buried 17th February 1902

and **Baden Joseph** born in 1901.

May Hope was baptised at Broughton on 27th May 1891. She married **Maurice Wilfred DAWKINS** at Broughton on 10th September 1923, and they subsequently had three sons : **Maurice G.** born at Stockbridge in 1924, **Charles H.L.** born at Stockbridge in 1931, and **Derrick R.** born at Romsey in 1934.

Thomas George Morgan was born on 14th April 1893 and baptised at Broughton on 20th August 1893. He married **Victoria Louise IREMONGER** in 1920, and they had four children :-

Josephine Louise born in 1925

and **Ruth Marion** born in 1927.

Thomas George Morgan (junior) was baptised at Broughton on 14th January 1921. He married **Sylvia BEECHAM** in 1956 in the Southampton area, and they had a daughter, **Sharon E.**, who was born in early 1958, and who married **James E.M. WOOD** in 1984. They also *adopted* Janine Caroline, who retained the HINWOOD name after marrying in 1991. **Thomas George Morgan** (junior) died in 1994 or 1995.

James Anthony was baptised at Broughton on 5th June 1922. He married **Peggy KERSLAKE** at Bury St.Edmunds, Suffolk, in 1944, and they had two children; **Roger A.K.** born in 1945 in the Derby area, and **Anthony H.** born in 1950 in the Winchester area.

Josephine Louise was baptised at Broughton on 17th May 1925.. She married **Edwin D. BOYES** early in 1953, probably at Broughton.

Ruth Marion was baptised on 21st November 1927. She married an Indian called **Hardev C. HARI** at Wood Green, London, in the summer of 1955.

Baden Joseph (also referred to as **Joseph Baden**) was baptised at Broughton on 6th October 1901, the youngest child of **George Edwin** and **Elizabeth Josephine**. He married **Annie JOYCE** in the Southampton area in 1927, and became a butcher in the Small Heath area of Birmingham. They had two children, **Baden Kenneth** who was baptised on 3rd June 1931 at Broughton, and **Joyce Ann** who was baptised on 9th September 1935 at Broughton.

Baden Kenneth married **Joan H. TOMKINS** at Bridgnorth in 1955. They had a son, **Paul Kenneth**, born in 1957 at Clun, who married **Kim L.A. RATCLIFF** in 1983. They had three children; **Erica Joanne** born in 1986 at Bromsgrove, **Jessica Louise** born in 1988 at Kidderminster, and **Jack Arthur** born in 1992 at Kidderminster. **Baden Kenneth** married secondly **Rosemary E. PAIN** at Bridgnorth in late 1961, and they had two daughters; **Vicky A.** born in 1963 at Bridgnorth (who married **Andrew P. KEY** in 1984), and **Clare Louise** born in 1965 at Bridgnorth.

Joyce Ann, the younger child of **Baden Joseph** and **Annie**, married **Robert E. MITCHELL** in 1959 in the Solihull area.

Elizabeth Josephine was buried on 10th July 1939 at Broughton and 77, and **George Edwin** died on 27th February 1960 aged 92.

FRED JOHN (423)

Fred John was born in 1870, a son of **Thomas** and **Ann**. He married **Jane Eliza SYMES** on 8th March 1892 at the Parish Church in Wokingham, Berkshire. He died before his father as his father's will mentioned **Jane Eliza** as his widow. They had two daughters, **Annie**, born at Wokingham in 1893, and **Myrtle**, baptised at Broughton on 30th September 1896 aged 5 months, and a son, **Ralph**, born 17th February 1897 and buried on 1st February 1903, and, it is believed, a further son, **Newton**, born in 1894. **Annie** married **Herbert F. SPREADBURY** in the South Stoneham area in September 1920. **Myrtle** married **Sidney J. LAWLER** at South Stoneham in 1922.

CHARLES MORGAN (425)

Charles Morgan was born in 1874, the youngest child of **Thomas** and **Ann**. He married **Margaret Harriet PRIESTMAN** (426) on 14th November 1900. She was buried at Broughton on 26th November 1928 aged 55. **Charles Morgan** subsequently married again to **Constance BELL** (427) in 1929, and they had a daughter, **Patricia Ann** (431) born in 1931 in the Salisbury area. **Charles Morgan** was buried at Broughton on 19th February 1934.

EDWIN JOHN (379)

Edwin John was born on 17th October 1843 and baptised on 26th November 1843 at West Dean, a son of **John Pester** and **Elizabeth**. He married **Kitty WHEELER** (380) (the daughter of **Thomas WHEELER**, a farmer) on 23rd June 1869 at Landford Parish Church, and they had five children, all born in the New Forest area :-

Anne Elizabeth baptised at Landford on 25th March 1873

Catherine born at Marchwood in 1875

Beatrice Mary born at Marchwood in 1878

Alice Maud born at Marchwood in 1880

and **Eva** born at Marchwood in 1882.

Catherine married **Charles GUNSTONE**, a builder, born in 1884 and the son of **Charles GUNSTONE**, on 4th October 1911 at Broughton Methodist Church.

Alice Maud married **Charles READ**, a widower and a hawker by trade, at Whaddon Methodist Church on 17th August 1911.

Eva married **Edwin J. BAVERSTOCK** at Steyning, Sussex, in 1913.

Following the death of **Kitty** aged 35 or 36 in 1882, **Edwin John** re-married **Eda Mary ROUNDS** (who was born in 1863) at Broughton Baptist Church on 26th April 1897. **Edwin John** was buried at Broughton on 13th December 1909, and **Eda Mary** was buried on 13th April 1949, aged 87.

JAMES ⁽³⁸²⁾

James was born at East Grimstead and baptised on 4th November 1849 at West Dean, a son of **John Pester** and **Elizabeth**. A baker and grocer, he married **Flora NOYCE** (who was born in 1856, a daughter of **Joseph Henry NOYCE** and **Ann**) of Broughton in 1877, and they had two children, both born at Over Wallop, Hampshire :-

Oliver James born in 1880

and **Sidney John** born on 14th March 1882, who appears never to have married.

Oliver James married **Gertrude Emily SHARP** (the daughter of **Herbert SHARP**) of Salisbury on 30th June 1903. They had two daughters, **Flora Muriel** born in 1905, and **Eileen M.** born in 1915, who married **Albert J. WILMOTT** in 1949, in the Romsey area.

LOUISA DEBORAH ⁽³⁸⁴⁾

Louisa Deborah was baptised on 29th May 1853 at West Dean, a daughter of **John Pester** and **Elizabeth**. She died in 1866 aged 13.

EVA ⁽³⁸⁵⁾

Eva was baptised on 25th October 1857 at West Dean, the youngest child of **John Pester** and **Elizabeth**. She married **William CARTER** ⁽⁴⁶¹⁾ in 1884 in the Alderbury area, and they had a son, **Stanley**.

MARY ANN RODBER ⁽³⁴⁵⁾

Mary Ann Rodber was a daughter of **William** and **Ann Rodber**, born on 17th May 1807. She was baptised privately on 18th May 1807, and again publicly on 7th June 1807 at North Tidworth.

SUSANNA ⁽³⁴⁶⁾

Susanna was a daughter of **William** and **Ann Rodber**, born on 9th November 1808. She was baptised immediately and died three days later. She was buried on 17th November 1808 at North Tidworth.

JANE ⁽³⁴⁷⁾

Jane was a daughter of **William** and **Ann Rodber**, born on 14th December 1809. She was baptised privately on 17th December 1809, and again publicly on 18th February 1810 at Stratford-sub-Castle. She was a schoolmistress and married **Henry LAWRENCE** on 6th January 1833. She died on 15th August 1888 aged 75, and was buried at West Dean

Henry was a dairyman in 1851, and ran a general store in 1871. He was born in 1808, and died on 3rd January 1890 aged 82.

THOMAS ⁽³⁴⁹⁾

Thomas was a son of **William** and **Ann Rodber**, born on 8th December 1813 at East Dean. He was baptised privately on 12th December 1813 and again publicly on 23rd January 1814 at Stratford-sub-Castle. He married **Ann LANGRIDGE**, born at East Dean on 23rd March 1820, a daughter of **William LANGRIDGE** and **Ann** (née **WEBB**), on 19th October 1842 at East Dean. (**William LANGRIDGE** and **Ann WEBB** had married on 18th January 1813 at East Dean). **Thomas** and **Ann** had thirteen children :-

Henry born 8th September 1846 and who died in 1847,

and **Charles** born in 1865, and who died the same year.

Jane was a daughter of **Thomas**'s brother **John**.

Thomas died on 18th September 1869 at West Dean. **Ann**, his widow, died in 1900 at Reigate.

WILLIAM LANGRIDGE ⁽³⁹¹⁾

William Langridge was a son of **Thomas** and **Ann**, baptised on 2nd March 1845, probably at West Dean. In the 1881 Census he was described as a chief clerk at Cuckfield, Sussex. He married **Elizabeth Ann HALL** on 17th October 1889 at St.Paul's Church, St.Leonards-on-Sea, Sussex. He died in 1927 at Bournemouth.

HENRY THOMAS ⁽³⁹²⁾

Henry Thomas was born on 4th January 1848 and baptised on 30th January 1848 at West Dean, a son of **Thomas** and **Ann**. He married **Rebecca SMITH** ⁽³⁹³⁾ on 10th October 1868. They had six children: **George Thomas**, **William James**, **Charles Henry**, **Edward Smith**, **Amy Jane** and **Beatrice Emma**. Further details of this family are given in Chapter 11.

SARAH ANN ⁽³⁹⁴⁾

Sarah Ann was a daughter of **Thomas** and **Ann**, baptised at West Dean on 23rd March 1850. She married **Thomas HARRINGTON** at Frimley, Surrey, in 1872. She is listed as having two daughters in the 1881 Census, **Annie G.** aged 4 and **Emma E.** aged 2. **Ann**, her mother, was evidently visiting at the time, when her son-in-law was employed as a servant at the Royal Military College, Sandhurst.

ELIZABETH JANE ⁽³⁹⁵⁾

Elizabeth Jane was baptised on 15th February 1852 at West Dean, a daughter of **Thomas** and **Ann**. She died at Bournemouth in 1936, a spinster.

JAMES RODBER ⁽³⁹⁶⁾

James Rodber was baptised on 6th November 1853 at West Dean, a son of **Thomas** and **Ann**. He was buried on 10th January 1854 aged 4 months.

GEORGE WEBB ⁽³⁹⁷⁾

George Webb was baptised on 10th December 1854 at West Dean, a son of **Thomas** and **Ann**. He died on 17th January 1880.

EDMOND (or EDWARD) JAMES ⁽³⁹⁸⁾

Edmond (or Edward) James was baptised on 7th August 1858, a son of **Thomas** and **Ann**. He was buried on 11th August 1858 aged 14 months.

EDWARD JOHN ⁽³⁹⁹⁾

Edward John was baptised on 18th September 1859, a son of **Thomas** and **Ann**. He died in the Cuckfield area in 1882.

ALFRED JAMES ⁽⁴⁰⁰⁾

Alfred James was baptised on 8th September 1861, a son of **Thomas** and **Ann**. In the 1881 Census he was described as a clerk of Seaford, Sussex. He married **Edith SAMPSON** (the

daughter of **Giles SAMPSON**, a farmer) on 6th June 1887 at St.Dionis, Fulham, by which time he had moved to Southsea. They had a daughter, **Edith Gertrude**, born in 1888, and a son, **Alfred J.C.**, born in 1892, both of whom married in Sussex. A grandson, **John A. HINWOOD**, was born at Steyning in 1924.

CHARLES ARTHUR ⁽⁴⁰¹⁾

Charles Arthur was born in 1863 and baptised on 3rd January 1864, a son of **Thomas** and **Ann**. He was buried on 16th February 1864, aged 8 months.

CHARLES ⁽⁴⁰²⁾

Charles was baptised on 29th March 1865, the youngest child of **Thomas** and **Ann**. He was buried on 17th April 1865.

WILLIAM EMMANUEL ⁽³⁵¹⁾

William Emmanuel was born on 29th June 1815 and baptised on 2nd July 1815 at Stratford-sub-Castle, a son of **William** and **Ann Rodber**. He died on 9th February 1816 aged 7 months, and was buried on 15th February 1816 at West Dean.

ELIZA ⁽³⁵²⁾

Eliza was born on 31st March 1820, the youngest child of **William** and **Ann Rodber**. She was baptised privately on 3rd April 1820 and again publicly on 27th August 1820 at West Dean. In 1851 she was living with her mother and brother, **Thomas**, and his family at West Dean. She married **Henry SWAYNE** (a blacksmith, the son of **John SWAYNE**) at West Dean on 25th December 1856.

HENRY THOMAS HINWOOD AND HIS FAMILY

HENRY THOMAS ⁽³⁹²⁾

Henry Thomas was born on 4th January 1848 at West Dean and baptised there on 30th January 1848. In 1851 he was staying with his grandmother **Ann LANGRIDGE** (née **WEBB**) at East Dean. He married **Rebecca SMITH** ⁽³⁹³⁾ at West Dean on 10th September 1868. **Rebecca SMITH** was born in 1842, a daughter of **George SMITH** and **Sarah Ann** (née **BEAVAN**) of Steeple Ashton. She was a schoolteacher and one of the first women to attend Bedford College, London. **Henry Thomas** and **Rebecca** had six children :-

Amy Jane born in 1876
and **Beatrice Emma** born in 1883

Henry Thomas lived in West Dean where he was a coach builder by trade. He died on 6th February 1885, and was buried there on 13th February 1885. **Rebecca** died in 1917.

GEORGE THOMAS ⁽⁴⁰³⁾

George Thomas was born on 24th January 1869 at West Dean and baptised there on 11th April 1869, the eldest son of **Henry Thomas** and **Rebecca**. (In the 1881 Census he was living with his uncle, **William Langridge HINWOOD**, at Cuckfield, Sussex). He studied to be a customs official, but had to give it up when his father died in order to obtain more immediate employment to support the family. He subsequently qualified for a master plumbers certificate in Portsmouth, but around 1891/92 he was living at St.Nicholas, Guildford.

George Thomas married **Agnes Emma CHALK** (née **FROUD**) from Hungerford, Fordingbridge (who had been born on 28th September 1869) at Fawley on 1st September 1892. **Agnes Emma**'s parents, **George CHALK** (born 19th March 1818, the son of **John CHALK** and **Harriet** [née **GAUNTLETT**] who married on 26th May 1834), and **Ann FROUD** or **KENCHINGTON** (born to **Harriet FROUD** and **Ambrose KENCHINGTON** on 19th July 1840) married on 29th January 1874, five years after her birth. **George Thomas** and **Agnes Emma** had seven children, all born at Badshotlea, Farnham, Surrey (although the family are believed to have moved to Llandudno about 1908) :-

Agnes Emma died in childbirth on 15th April 1913 and was buried at Llanrhos on 18th April 1913. **George Thomas** later married **Maud Matilda SEARELL** ⁽⁴⁰⁵⁾ on 14th April 1923 at Llandudno. **Maud Matilda** was born on 9th November 1881 at Portmadoc, the daughter of **William Shinner SEARELL** from Staverton, Devon, and **Rebecca Catherine BEAVAN** from Guernsey. **George Thomas** died on 31st December 1935 and was buried at St.Tudno's, Llandudno, on 1st January 1936. **Maud Matilda** died in 1962, just after Christmas.

NEVILLE ⁽⁴³⁶⁾

Neville was born on 25th October 1894, a son of **George Thomas** and **Agnes Emma**. He was awarded the Military Medal in the First World War, and was a senior architect (A.R.I.B.A.), working for the Ministry of Works in London for many years. He married **Olwen DAVIES** ⁽⁴³⁷⁾ (born at Festiniog, Merionethshire, on 9th March 1893, a daughter of **Lewis DAVIES**, a tailor, and **Elizabeth A. DAVIES** [née **THOMPSON**], and who died on 6th October 1933) in 1918 at Llandudno, and they had two children :-

Margaret Elizabeth (Peggy) born at Cheam, Surrey, in 1922
and **Barbara Olwen** born at Cheam, Surrey, in 1925.

Neville later married **Mary Margaret (May) HYDE** (the daughter of **Tom HYDE**) in 1937 at Llanrhos, and they had two children, both born at Belmont, Sutton, Surrey :-

Patricia born in 1943
and **Adrian Neville** born in 1944.

Neville died in 1978, just two weeks after **Adrian's** wedding. **Mary Margaret** lived in Sutton, Surrey, and she died in December 1986 aged 75 or 76.

MARGARET ELIZABETH (PEGGY) ⁽⁴⁴⁵⁾

Margaret Elizabeth was born in 1922, the elder child of **Neville** and **Olwen**. She married Dr. **Richard WARD** ⁽⁴⁴⁶⁾ in 1944 and they had three children: **Felicity** born in 1947, **Elizabeth** born in 1950 and **Melanie** born in 1954. At the time of writing **Margaret Elizabeth** and **Richard** lived at Mellor, Lancashire, though they also had a winter home at Lanzarote in the Canary Islands. They are since deceased, having died circa. 2004.

Felicity married firstly to Professor **Patrick NOWELL-SMITH** in 1968 and had two daughters: **Harriet** born in 1970 and **Kate** born in 1972. **Felicity** subsequently married Professor **Richard POPE**, and at the time of writing are based in the Toronto area of Canada.

Elizabeth married **John Roger HOYLE** in 1972 and had four children: **William** born in 1975, **Lucy** born in 1977, **Benjamin** born in 1980, and **Charlotte** born in 1983. They are now living in Mellor.

Melanie married **Tim GARTSIDE** in 1982 and they had three children, all born at Stoke Newington: **Hannah E.** born in 1987, **Jessica G.** born in 1990, and **Imogen R.** born in 1993. At the time of writing they are living in Australia.

BARBARA OLWEN (447)

Barbara Olwen was born in 1925, the younger child of **Neville** and **Olwen**. She married **Lewis Denton ROWE** (448) on 27th October 1956 at St.John's Belmont, and they had two children; **Nicholas Denton** born in 1957, and **Alexander Lovell** born in 1959. **Barbara Olwen** divorced her husband and subsequently lived in Knightsbridge, London S.W.1, before she died following a short illness on 24th April 1998. and

Nicholas Denton married **Abigail LOCOCK** at Whitsbury, Hampshire, in 1990 and had one son, **William George** born in 1993, and one daughter, **Flora Alice**, born in 1995. **Alexander Lovell** married **Eliza RODGER-BROWN** (the daughter of **Donald RODGER-BROWN**) at St.Mary the Virgin Church, Glemsford, Suffolk, on 30th April 1994. They had one child, **Oscar Lovell**, born in 1998.

PATRICIA (451)

Patricia was born in 1943, the elder child of **Neville** and **Mary Margaret**. She was a fashion model in the 1960's, and married **Arved VAN OETTINGEN** at St.John's, Belmont on 30th June 1973 and they had two children; **Sean** born in 1977, and **Mirella** born in 1980. **Patricia** subsequently divorced **Arved**, and at the time of writing is living at Ballito, Natal, South Africa, with her two children.

ADRIAN NEVILLE (449)

Adrian Neville was born in 1944, the younger child of **Neville** and **Mary Margaret**. He studied accountancy and married **Sandra Christine HUNTER** (née **WEARN**) on 9th September 1978 at St.Andrew's, Cheam, but divorced with no children. He re-married **Cathryn M. MOAR** in 1987 in the Croydon area, and subsequently emigrated to Brisbane, Australia.

GLADYS ELEANOR (440)

Gladys Eleanor was born on 2nd March 1899, a daughter of **George Thomas** and **Agnes Emma**. Whilst studying at the University of Wales, Bangor, she met and later married **Robert Pryce WILLIAMS** on 10th December 1921 at St.George's, Llandudno, and they had three children: **Joan Barbara P.** born in 1922, **Peter Neville P.** born in 1926 and who died (killed by a drunken driver) in 1977, and **David George Pryce** born in 1936.

Robert Pryce was born on 15th May 1889 at Chwilog, Caernarvonshire, a son of **Peter WILLIAMS** and **Janet** (née **PRYCE**) who had married on 14th June 1878 at Llanaelhaearn, Caernarvonshire. He was a B.A. and senior inspector of taxes for over 20 years, and died on 18th February 1957 at High Wycombe. **Gladys Eleanor** died on 2nd August 1990.

Joan Barbara P. was an accomplished artist who was listed in "Who's Who in Art". Her work has been exhibited both in the U.K. and internationally. **Peter Neville P.** was a musician and educational psychologist (G.T.C.L. and M.A.). **David George Pryce** trained as an architect and photographer, and at the time of writing is still unmarried. In 2001, **Joan Barbara P.** unfortunately suffered a stroke and was treated at Westbank, Borough Green, where she died in August 2002. **David George Pryce** took early retirement to visit her every month.

ETHEL ⁽⁴⁴²⁾

Ethel was born on 22nd January 1901, the youngest daughter of **George Thomas** and **Agnes Emma**. She was a dentist's receptionist, then a live-in "ladies companion", and looked after various members of the family when old or ill, and was a skilled cook. She travelled to South Africa to see **Patricia** (her niece) in 1981/82. She never married and died on 23rd November 1983 at Amersham.

HAROLD ROY ⁽⁴⁴³⁾

Harold Roy was born on 25th March 1904 at Farnham, the youngest child of **George Thomas** and **Agnes Emma**. He married **Gwendoline Maud RELF** ⁽⁴⁴⁴⁾ (born 23rd June 1906, the daughter of **Joseph Henry RELF** and **Evelyn** [née **HUGHES**], who were married on 21st June 1905) on 9th April 1929 at Trinity Church, Llandudno, and they had one child, **Anthony Roy** born in 1935.

Harold Roy ran a photography business in Deganwy, Caernarvonshire, for approximately 25 years. He died on 22nd September 1972, and **Gwendoline Maud** died on 7th May 1973.

ANTHONY ROY ⁽⁴⁵³⁾

Anthony Roy was born on 20th August 1935, the only child of **Harold Roy** and **Gwendoline Maud**. He married **Shirley Anita WITTS** ⁽⁴⁵⁴⁾, the daughter of **Donald WITTS** and **Christine Sylvia** (née **WATERS**), on 8th July 1967 at St.Paul's, Yelverton, Devon, and they had one child, **Claire Louise** born in 1969.

At the time of writing **Anthony Roy** is living near Hindhead, Surrey, and is self-employed as a landlord and advertising consultant. **Shirley Anita** was born on 27th June 1936 at St. Mary Cray, Kent.

CLAIRE LOUISE ⁽⁴⁵⁵⁾

Claire Louise was born on 9th March 1969 at Liss, Hampshire, the only child of **Anthony Roy** and **Shirley Anita**. She was baptised at St.Paul's, Yelverton, Devon, on 25th December 1969. She plays principal cornet in, and tours with her local town band, and worked as a supervisor in legal education administration. *Claire Louise and her mother, Shirley Anita, have been undertaking Hinwood research since 1982, and their assistance with the earlier records which have been used in this booklet is gratefully acknowledged.*

Since 1997, **Claire** has married twice, first to **Jonathan M. GILLETT** in 1998 at Grayshatt, then to **Graham WADE** in 2003 at Langrish, by whom she has had two children, **Kathrine Megan** 2006, and **Matthew Robert**, 2009. About this time during the major recession of 2008/09, she was dismissed from her job, just as the extensions to her house were completed.

WILLIAM JAMES ⁽⁴⁰⁶⁾

William James was baptised on 4th September 1870 at West Dean, a son of **Henry Thomas** and **Rebecca**. He was a plumber and married **Amanda Kathleen MITCHELL** (daughter of **George MITCHELL**, a plumber) on 25th May 1896 at St.Denys', South Stoneham. He died in 1898 and his widow re-married in late 1899.

CHARLES HENRY ⁽⁴⁰⁷⁾

Charles Henry was baptised at West Tytherley, Hampshire, in 1872, the son of **Henry Thomas** and **Rebecca**. He married **Clara LOVELAND** in 1919 in the Farnham area, but had no children.

EDWARD SMITH (408)

Edward Smith was baptised in 1874, a son of **Henry Thomas** and **Rebecca**. He was known as “**Ned**” and died on 24th January 1881, and was buried on 29th January 1881 at West Dean aged 6 years.

AMY JANE (409)

Amy Jane was baptised in 1876 at Fisherton, a daughter of **Henry Thomas** and **Rebecca**. She died on 15th April 1893 aged 16 years and 4 months.

BEATRICE EMMA (410)

Beatrice Emma was baptised in 1883 at West Dean, the youngest child of **Henry Thomas** and **Rebecca**. She died in 1887 aged 3 years and 7 months, and her tombstone bears the nickname “**Dol**”.

THE HINWOODS OF SOUTH AFRICA

At least two HINWOODs emigrated to South Africa. Neither have been definitely connected to the main HINWOOD families of Wiltshire, but the similarity of names suggests that they do belong, and were probably brothers.

HARRY WILLIAM ⁽⁵⁵³⁾

Harry William was born in the Spitalfields area of London around 1830, a son of **William** and **Harriett**. He married **Elizabeth VEAL** ⁽⁵⁵⁴⁾ (a daughter of **Joseph VEAL**) on 25th January 1852 at Southampton and they had three sons and six daughters [all of whom are detailed in Chapter 8]. Only the families of two of the sons are relevant to the South African connection however. **Henry Edsell** (born in 1854) and **William Shepard** (born in 1866). **Harry William** was a mast maker by trade.

HENRY EDSSELL ⁽⁵²²⁾

Known as **Harry**, **Henry Edsell** was baptised on 14th November 1854 at Southampton. He was the eldest son of **Harry William HINWOOD** and **Elizabeth VEAL**. He emigrated to South Africa and married **Elizabeth LOVELESS** at Cradock in the north-east Cape Colony on 5th March 1879. They had eleven children :-

An unnamed son, still-born on 12th January 1880 at Cradock,
Edsell Hines, baptised in 1882 at Cradock,
Florence Mary, baptised in 1884 at Steynsburg (north-east Cape Colony),
Verne Carmalt, baptised in 1885 at Steynsburg,
Alma Joy, baptised in 1887 at Steynsburg,
Harry Clive, baptised in 1889 at Somerset East (eastern Cape Colony),
Rupert Noel, baptised in 1890 at Cookhouse (eastern Cape Colony),
Ella Dorothy, baptised in 1892,
Ernest Douglas, baptised in 1895 at Cookhouse,
Bertram Sheppard, baptised in 1896,
and **Edith Doris**, born in 1899 at Southampton, U.K..

Harry died on 12th November 1905 at Somerset East, eastern Cape Colony, South Africa, aged 51. **Elizabeth** was born on 16th May 1859 at Fort Beaufort, eastern Cape Colony, South Africa. She died on 25th May 1923 at Somerset East, eastern Cape Province, South Africa, aged 64 years.

EDSELL HINES ⁽⁵²⁵⁾

Edsell Hines was born on 13th May 1882, and baptised at St.Peter's Church, Cradock, Cape Colony, South Africa. He was the eldest surviving child of **Henry Edsell** and **Elizabeth**. He married **Ethel May COLLANDER** at the Magistrate's Office, Durban, Natal, South Africa, on 9th October 1935, and they had three children :-

Pamela Collander, born in 1922 at Johannesburg, Transvaal,
Mavis Cheyne Collander, born in 1926 at Johannesburg,
and **Nan Edsell**, born in 1929 at Port Shepstone, Natal.

Edsell Hines died on 31st July 1965 at Post Shepstone, Natal, aged 83 years. **Ethel May** was born at Lancaster, U.K..

PAMELA COLLANDER ⁽⁵⁴⁰⁾

Pamela Collander was born on 9th April 1922 at Johannesburg, Transvaal, the eldest child of **Edsell Hines** and **Ethel May**. She married **Anthony Stroud MARTIN** ⁽⁵⁴¹⁾ at an English church in Northern Rhodesia on 4th July 1952.

MAVIS CHEYNE COLLANDER ⁽⁵⁴²⁾ (she was always going for a leak)

Mavis Cheyne Collander was born on 5th September 1926 at Johannesburg, Transvaal, a daughter of **Edsell Hines** and **Ethel May**.

NAN EDSSELL ⁽⁵⁴³⁾

Nan Edsell was born on 22nd April 1929 at Port Shepstone, Natal, the youngest child of **Edsell Hines** and **Ethel May**. She married **Jeremy John TURNER** on 6th October 1962 at Hilton College Chapel, Hilton, Natal.

FLORENCE MARY ⁽⁵²⁷⁾

Florence Mary was born on 7th March 1884 at Steynsburg, Cape Colony, a daughter of **Henry Edsell** and **Elizabeth**. She married **Charles Edward STIBOLPH** ⁽⁵²⁸⁾ on 29th September 1908 at All Saints Church, Somerset East, Cape Colony. She died on 15th October 1953 at East London, Cape Province, South Africa.

VERNE CARMALT ⁽⁵²⁹⁾

Verne Carmalt was born on 3rd October 1885 at Steynsburg, Cape Colony, a daughter of **Henry Edsell** and **Elizabeth**. She died in November 1888 at Cookhouse, Cape Colony.

ALMA JOY ⁽⁵³⁰⁾

Alma Joy was born on 2nd January 1887 at Steynsburg, Cape Colony, a daughter of **Henry Edsell** and **Elizabeth**. She married **Gordon Frank HUSSKISSON** ⁽⁵³¹⁾ on 2nd January 1907 at All Saints Church, Somerset East, Cape Colony.

HARRY CLIVE ⁽⁵³²⁾

Harry Clive was born on 30th May 1889 and baptised at All Saints Church, Somerset East, Cape Colony. He was the son of **Henry Edsell** and **Elizabeth**. He went to the U.K. to study medicine and married **Helen Williamson RAMSAY** on 30th April 1918 at the United Free Church, Dunfermline, Fife. They had two children :-

Vera Elizabeth, born in 1919 at Dunfermline,
and **Harry Clive Ramsay**, born in 1930.

Harry Clive died in England in September 1944. **Helen Williamson**, who was born in 1891, died in 1976.

VERA ELIZABETH ⁽⁵⁴⁷⁾

Vera Elizabeth was born in 1919 at Dunfermline, Fife, the elder child of **Harry Clive** and **Helen Williamson**. She married **Norman Ernest POVEY** in 1945 and they had two children, **Christopher** and **Norman Clive**. **Christopher** married **Christine** (surname unknown) and they had two children, **Adam** and **Charlotte**.

HARRY CLIVE RAMSAY ⁽⁵⁴⁵⁾

Harry Clive Ramsay was born in 1930, the younger child of **Harry Clive** and **Helen Williamson**. He studied medicine, and at the time of writing is in practice at Telford, Shropshire. He married **Helen Mary HARLOW** in 1958 in the Burton-on-Trent area, and they had two children, **David Clive** ⁽⁵⁴⁹⁾, born in 1961, and **Neil John** ⁽⁵⁵⁰⁾ born in 1962.

RUPERT NOEL ⁽⁵³⁴⁾

Rupert Noel was born on 3rd November 1890 at Cookhouse, Cape Colony, and was baptised at Cape Town, western Cape Colony. He was a son of **Henry Edsell** and **Elizabeth**. He married **Alice HUSSKISON** on 7th January 1925 at Port Elizabeth, eastern Cape Province.

ELLA DOROTHY ⁽⁵³⁵⁾

Ella Dorothy was born on 17th February 1892 at Cookhouse, Cape Colony. She was a daughter of **Henry Edsell** and **Elizabeth**. She died at sea on board *C.M.S. Dunottan Castle* and was buried at sea, 4 deg. 00 min., 13 deg. 02 min. W.

ERNEST DOUGLAS ⁽⁵³⁶⁾

Ernest Douglas was born on 27th August 1895 at Cookhouse, Cape Colony. He was a son of **Henry Edsell** and **Elizabeth**. He died at Cookhouse on 23rd April 1896.

BERTRAM SHEPPARD ⁽⁵³⁷⁾

Bertram Sheppard was born on 2nd October 1896 at Cookhouse, Cape Colony. He married **Valerie Gwendoline STAPLES** ⁽⁵⁵²⁾ on 12th May 1923 at St.Barnabas Church, Middleburg, north-eastern Cape Province. He died in May 1955 at Bulawayo, Southern Rhodesia.

EDITH DORIS ⁽⁵³⁸⁾

Edith Doris was born on 12th December 1899 at Southampton, Hampshire. She was the youngest child of **Henry Edsell** and **Elizabeth**. She married **Alfred Kay PRENTICE** in about 1929, possibly at Southampton. They had a daughter, **Ann**. **Ann** married **Peter WHYTE-SWEET**.

WILLIAM SHEPARD ⁽⁵⁶⁰⁾

William Shepard was born on 24th March 1866 at 14 Victoria Terrace, Northam, Southampton, Hampshire. He was the youngest son of **Harry William** and **Elizabeth**. He emigrated to South Africa, and there he married **Lillian Mary REDDEL** ⁽⁵⁶¹⁾ on 25th June 1896 at the Presbyterian Church, Somerset East, Cape Colony. They had two children :-

Hewitt Victor, born in 1897 at Middelburg, Cape Colony,
and **Leo William**, born in 1903 at Steynsburg, Cape Colony.

HEWITT VICTOR ⁽⁵⁶²⁾

Hewitt Victor was born on 3rd September 1897 at Middelburg, Cape Colony. He was the elder son of **William Shepard** and **Lillian Mary**. He married on 22nd September 1928 at the Methodist Church, Hillbrow, Johannesburg, Transvaal, and they had two sons :-

Edward Victor, born in 1930 at Johannesburg, Transvaal,
and **Lionel John**, born in 1936.

EDWARD VICTOR ⁽⁵⁶⁶⁾

Edward Victor was born on 12th January 1930 at Johannesburg, Transvaal. He was the elder son of **Hewitt Victor**. He was ordained a Roman Catholic priest on 3rd July 1960 in Rome as Father **Bonaventure HINWOOD** OFM, and became a regular and controversial panellist on SABC television religious discussion programmes chaired by Bill Chalmers.

LIONEL JOHN ⁽⁵⁶⁷⁾

Lionel John was born on 3rd December 1936, the younger son of **Hewitt Victor**. In 1974 he was still a bachelor.

LEO WILLIAM ⁽⁵⁶⁴⁾

Leo William was born on 5th January 1903 at Steynsburg, Cape Colony. He was the younger son of **William Shepard** and **Lillian Mary**. He married **Margaret Brown McDONALD** in 1927. They had no issue. **Leo William** died in August 1973 at Johannesburg, Transvaal.
